BEARDED IRISES

July and August are the best months for transplanting iris, but they may be planted very successfully in September or October where the climate permits rooting before winter; light protective straw mulch is helpful. Plant shallow in sunny, well drained locations. Avoid excessive watering. Fertilize moderately with bonemeal.
