## Your Lily Garden

If you have a partially shaded spot in your yardperhaps in among the shrubs-that is fairly well drained, plant Lilies in it. Lilies will fill up that space and make it a pleasing sight every day in the Summer. They are cool loolsing on hot days with their kingly bearing and foliage of green, contrasted with the pure waxy colors of the flower.

Plant Lilies informally in clumps or large masses. place the bulbs six to eight inches deep with a handful of sand around each one, so that the water will easily run off. If the soil is well enriched, so much the better for the size and beauty of the flower.
