THIS year (1924) marks our 45th year in the seed trade. We wish to thank our old friends and customers for their patronage and good-will, and will continue this year as before to merit their faithfulness with the higher quality and lower prices which our many years of experience in the business coupled with our modern methods of cleaning, caring and testing seeds, and buying and contracting in large quantities, can accomplish. We are also looking forward to serving many new customers this year, and for their enlightenment as to our methods of doing business we request that they read the following paragraphs on this page and page two.

For many years it has been our custom to publish an annual illustrated catalogue listing and describing our full line of Field, Flower and Garden Seeds, Implements, Poultry Supplies, etc. We are now dispensing with the illustrations, descriptions and detail and substituting instead an inexpensive plain price list. By doing this we are saving an enormous overhead expense which would have to be added to the costs, and for this reason we are now enabled to allow our customers to benefit by the difference, and still adhere to the same standard of quality that has made so many friends for us in the past.

We are proud of our record for dependable seeds, which we have earned by diligent care and selection and for the fact that every lot of seed that enters our building or is carried over from one year to another is carefully tested for germination in our laboratory before it is offered for sale.

Saul's Seeds come to you packed in plain packages. No fancy colored lithographs, but larger quantities and better quality. Every 5 cent envelope, ounce, one-fourth pound and pound package is weighed up from the bulk at the time that the order is received. The only exception to this rule being in the case of one or two varieties of vegetable seeds, a few herbs and many flower seeds which are so small in size, light in weight and expensive in price, and that it is impossible to weigh and have to be measured or counted to sell for small amounts. This is done before the seed season opens to save time. "Buy your seeds from the bulk and let your money pay for larger measure and fresher stock."

How to Order Please be careful to sign your Name, Post Office, County, and State on each and every letter sent us. Cash should accompany the order. See instructions below on how to send money.

You Run No Risk in sending cash with order. My reputation as an honest and experienced Seedsman is well known, while my financial responsibility can be learned from any Bank, Trust Company, or Merchant who subscribes to either of the Commercial Agency Reports.

Bags 15 cents must be added for every $\frac{1}{4}$ Bu. and 20 cents for $\frac{1}{2}$ Bu. of seed ordered and 45 cents for every 1 Bu. or over to 2 Bu. lot, to cover cost of new bags in which to ship.

Our Terms are Strictly Cash with the Order. We do not send C. O. D., as the cost of collecting return charges is quite an unnecessary item of expense and the prices being given, we can conceive of no necessity to warrant goods being so sent.

How to Send Money. Remittances may be made at our risk by any of the following methods, viz.: **Postal Money Order, Draft on New York or Chicago, or Express Company's Money Orders, or cash by Registered Letter.** We accept clean postage stamps the same as cash.

The rates charged for Postal Money Orders and Express Money Orders are now so low that these are the best way to remit. We will bear the expense of sending money in either of these ways. Deduct the cost of the order from amount sent, Express Money Orders can be obtained at all offices of the Principal Express Companies. They are **cheap and absolutely safe.**

Guarantee: Complaints made that seeds are not good, should quite as often be attributed to other causes as to the quality of the seeds. There are hundreds of contingencies continually arising to prevent the best seeds always giving satisfaction, such as sowing too deep, too shallow, in too wet or too dry soil; insects of all descriptions destroying the plants as soon as or before they appear; wet weather, cold weather, frosts, chemical changes in the seeds, induced by temperature, etc. For the above reasons it is impracticable to guarantee seeds under all circumstances.

We give no warranty, express or implied, as to description, purity, productiveness, or any other matter of any seeds we send out, and we will not be in any way responsible for the crop. If the purchaser does not accept the goods on these terms they are at once to be returned.
