We ask attention to the small-sized trees offered for transplanting into nursery rows. \section*{FREEZING WEATHER}

There is always more or less danger of trees being caught en route in freezing weather in Spring. We pack in such a manner that should the contents of the boxes freeze solid on the way to our customers the trees will receive no injury if the frost is allowed time to come out before the trees are removed from the boxes. The trees should be taken from the boxes as soon as frost is out, or should there be no frost in the boxes when received, the trees should be removed from the boxes immediately upon arrival. We practice in this respect what the experience of many years has taught us. If our customers will follow these rules and notify us of the condition of the trees at once when taken from the boxes we will guarantee good condition. Notice should be sent to us at once by telegraph, at our expense, if there is any cause of complaint or should the trees be refused, stating reasons. The trees will be considered accepted if removed from the boxes in which they are packed.
