All our nursery lands are 50 to 250 feet above the Missouri river flood line.

Dealers and others will find our facilities for the careful, rapid handling of stock first class in every respect. Storage buildings and sheds are ample, with an abundant supply of water; 140,000 cubic feet of frost-proof cold storage.

NEW HAVEN is on the Missouri Pacific Railway, and also on the Missouri river, sixty-seven miles west of St. Louis by rail.

Digging and Shipping season usually begins about October 5, and continues till April 15.

Packing in the very best manner. Paper-lined boxes at cost, as follows: 20x20x9 feet, \$1.25; 24x24x9 feet, \$1.75; 30x30x9 feet, \$2.25.

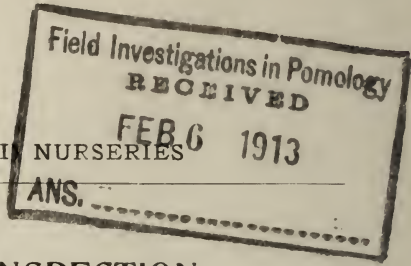
