## ATTENTION! IMPORTANT!

This is what Mr. Chas. E. F. Gersdorff wrote of my Chautauqua Red in his Garden Note of Gladiolus in October number, 1922.

Chautauqua Red, brilliant flame scarlet, fine for cutting, brilliant in the garden. Spike strong and slender, 46 in., 12 to 18 blooms. Fairly compact to compact, many open $31 / 2 \mathrm{in}$, wide, open excellent substance blooming 8-12 days, cormels prolific. Planted 5-18-22 and bloomed 7-28-22.

I hope that it may be possible for you to exhibit your varieties at Kalamazoo, and hope that your Primulinus varieties which have always been of decided merit may win the coveted certificates.
