Snow-white. Large incurved white. Nov. 1st. Take terminal bud. Rooted cuttings, \$12.00 per 100, \$100.00 per 1000.

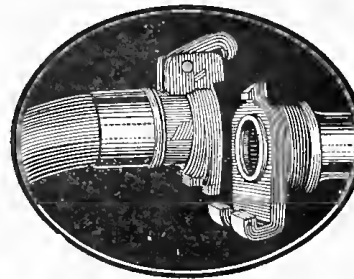
