## Packing and Local Delivery

All stock shipped by us is packed with utmost care, so as to insure delivery in good condition. Quantity orders delivered by motor trucks within a day's trip of the Nursery at cost.

## Shipping Season

The shipping season opens about April 1st and August 1st.

## Proper Care of Nursery Stock on Receipt

If upon receipt of Nursery stock you find you will be unable to plant it at once, do not leave the plants in the container. Unpack immediately upon receipt and heel in soil in a shady position. Simply dig a trench or hole large enough to receive all the roots and cover roots well with soil, then soak thoroughly with water. By doing this the plants will remain in perfect condition for several days whereas, if allowed to remain in a box for several days, it would be sure to kill them or at least seriously impair the vitality of the plants. In planting, never allow the roots to become exposed to drying winds. It is well to take a pail into which you have put about equal amounts of clay, soil and water mixed to a creamy consistency and before planting puddle roots in this mixture. This will hold moisture' about roots for a long time.
