Lilium Washingtonianum

(Mt. Hood or Shasta Lily)

This enchantingly lovely lily is a native of the Cascade Mountains. It is hardy, fragrant, and bears in a cluster at the top from one to twenty-five or more exquisite blossoms.

Each blossom is about four or five inches across and about as deep. It is of the open trumpet form, and is marked with deep lavender spots. The petals are white, deepening with age to a dainty lavender pink.

These lilies can be propagated by bulb division, also from seed.

L. Washingtonianum needs and indeed must have good drainage in order to thrive. They do best in fairly rich, sandy soil, and they appreciate being grown in a partly shaded location. Here they grow to perfection beneath the trees with the sunshine filtering thru.

Plant so the top of the bulb is not more than six inches below the surface of the soil, and be sure to provide really good drainage. In heavy soil, use sand under and about the bulb, and leaf mold for fertilizer where available. Moisture must have opportunity to escape or the bulb will rot.

Plant as soon as bulbs are received in the fall.
