The awakening desire for civic improvement and for beautifying town and country properties has prompted us to reduce our stocks of fruit trees, and increase acreages in ornamentals, but in APPLE and PEACH and other trees, we have we believe excellent stock in a wide assortment of varieties, to which we invite your special attention.

We feel we have spared no pains in the propagation of these trees to maintain their integrity and keep varieties free of mixtures. And are glad to announce that Tennessee was represented at the Shaw School of Nursery Identification at it's summer session in Iowa for 1926 and all our peach and apple trees will be rigidly inspected this month, under the rules of this School of Identification, and our employes will be given a course of instruction in this important work. We do not intend to pass on to our customers any of the expense incident to this inspection, there will be no added price or charge for these trees, the work is simply in line with our fixed aim to do all that is humanly possible to make sure that our trees are permanently satisfactory to our customers.

We hope that we may hear from you at an early date and may be allowed to take care of your fall wants, whatever they may be.
