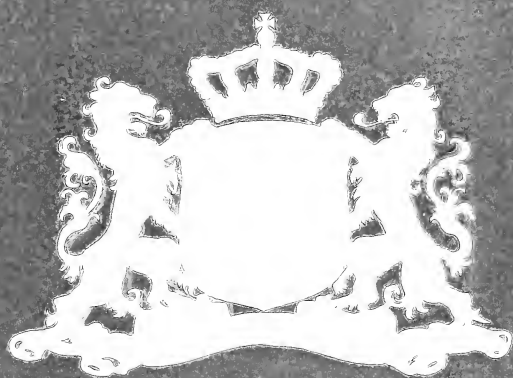

INTRODUCTION



WHEN we were called upon a third of a century ago to exhibit our products at the great Chicago World's Fair, we could not then show as perfect bulbs, flower roots and plants as we are now able to do. As we intend having expositions continually, we most cordially invite every one interested to visit our trial grounds.

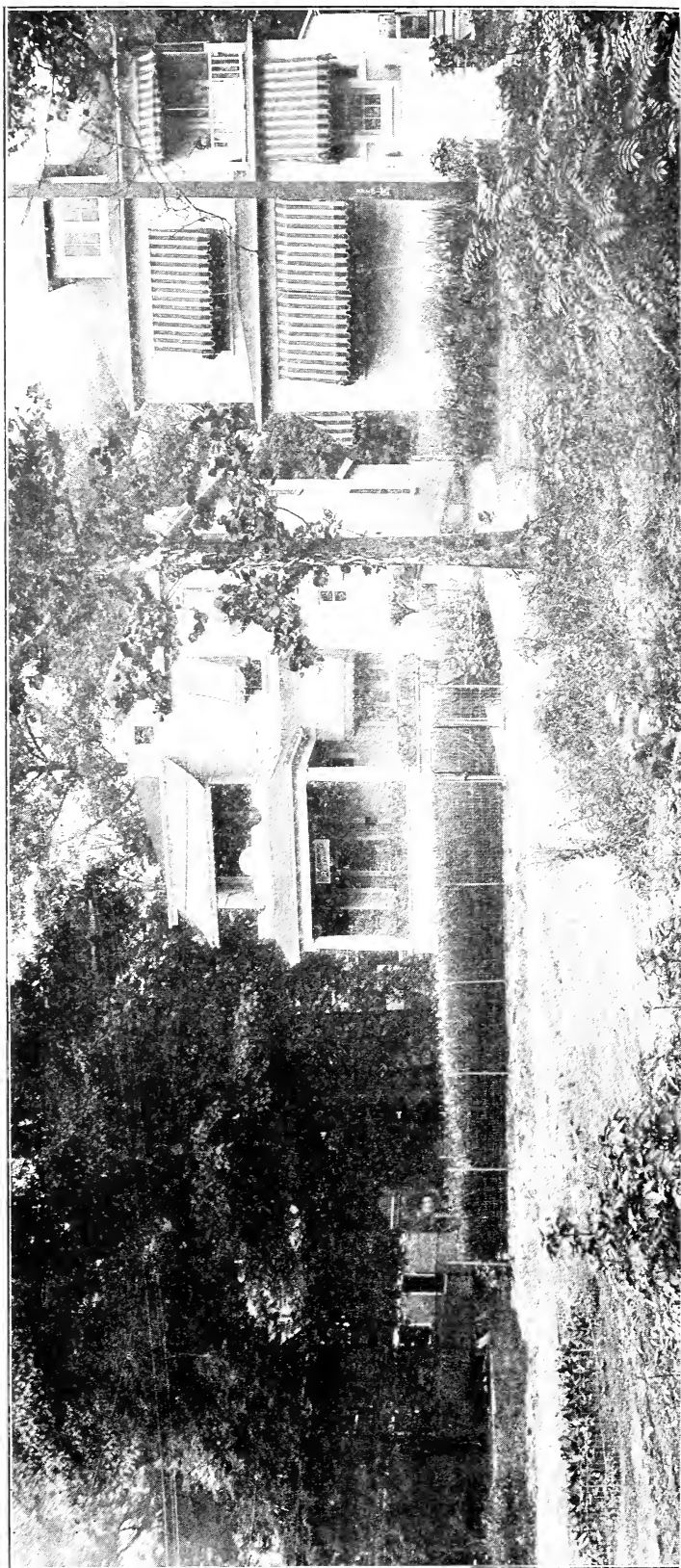
