AMUN RA. (Seal) Giant flowers, coppery bronze shading to gold and amber.

GLADYS SHERWOOD. Giant form, pure white, hybrid cactus.

MRS. I. DE WARNER (Mareau). Strong, vigorous grower; color clear self-pink-lavender, generally described as "mauve."

JERSEY'S BEAUTY (Waite). Soft rose pink on vigorous stems of from 4 to 5 feet without forcing; probably the best dahlia in existence.

OUR SELECTIONS OF THE BEST GLADIOLI

We are requested so frequently to give our opinion of the most desirable among the more than 200 varieties of gladioli that we do so herewith. (In this list we have eliminated our own originations).

The Leaders in Our Fields

Albania. A superb white, early and with no pink showing, as in White Wonder. Prolific and an early bloomer. **Europa**, second best, is rather difficult to handle. **Peace**, among old standards, is a third choice.

Crimson Glow. A good scarlet of fine habits: prolific and comparatively early. Almost the same shade as the higher priced Scarlet Wonder. "Cowee's Scarlet."

E. J. Shaylor. A clear, rose pink, very finely ruffled and a very excellent variety for the up-to-date florist.

Golden Measure. The world's best yellow and probably the most vigorous gladiolus: suggests a pine tree in size and sturdiness. **Souvenir** and **Butterboy**, both primis, are our second and third choice. **Flora** has bad habits and is hardly worth while.

Louise. A true lavender-orchid color. Superior to Sweet Lavender, Costa Rica and as good as Mrs. Frederick C. Peters in our opinion.

Best Exhibition Varieties

Pink Wonder. A whiteish pink, heavily frosted and suggesting some of the super Japanese irises. Petals are 6 to 6½ inches across.

Mrs. Leon Douglass. Begonia rose, stippled flame scarlet: lip, pale lemon slightly speckled ruby. Probably is the largest gladioli in the world and shares with **Golden Measure** the honor of being the most vigorous. Price still a little high.

The Best Primulinus Varieties

Alice Tiplady. We have been the best missionaries to the trade for this variety. It is a gorgeous orange saffron, showing vivid bronze shades under artificial light. Under ordinary cultivation every No. 1 size bulb should produce three new bulbs of same size. In sandy-loam soil this variety will bloom in 48 days, making it a leader in this respect. Not a "thin" prim; large bloom.

Maiden's Blush. A dainty pink and very good for decorative work.

Halley, Tiplady, Maiden's Blush, Souvenir, Butterboy.
