Just write on your order "Don't Substitute" if you want sizes ordered only. We never substitute on varieties unless asked to. Our aim is to please our customers.

Cash with order. We prepay transportation on all orders of \$3 or over. With orders for less add 15% to help pay postage. No less than 25 bulbs at 100 rate; 250 bulbs or over of one kind at 10 per cent discount. We ship from March 15 on, or earlier if weather conditions favorable. Immediate shipment if requested.

On bulblets we will give a 10 per cent discount for 5000 of one variety or five quarts of one variety. 10 per cent discount on 10 quarts or 10,000 bulblets of assorted varieties.

Remember, we make no effort to compete in price against badly mixed, poorly grown, or inferior stock. We give our customers their money's worth.

Twenty-five per cent deposit will hold bulbs until March 15. We will send C.O.D. for balance unless remittance received before shipping date.

She is able to take orders for seeds of many rare and splendid specimens of Oregon flora which will add charm to your plantings and pleasure to your garden work. Miss McMunn is doing a great work in aiding to preserve our wonderful wild flowers and your support will materially assist her.

SOME CULTURAL SUGGESTIONS

Planting Bulbs—Any time ground is in good condition in spring plant large bulbs about four inches deep, and not less than four inches apart. Smaller bulbs plant a little shallower. Don't let manure come in contact with bulbs. Sunny position is best.

Cultivation—Keep well cultivated and well watered. Water deeply when watering and not so often. Cultivate frequently, if possible, for best results.

Digging—Dig in fall, preferably late September or October. It is best to dig before tops are killed by frost. Cut off tops close to bulb as soon as dug. Let bulbs cure in sun, keeping away from frost. Store in cool, dry place, away from heat, frost and moisture. Keep in shallow boxes, if possible, and stir occasionally to give air.

Cutting Blooms—Leave at least four leaves on plant in cutting. Cut when first bloom opens and spike will bloom to tip. Keep water fresh and every day or two cut off quarter of inch of stem. When cutting, cut stem with slanting slice.
