Forwarding—All shrubs, bulbs, roots, and plants are forwarded by express at the purchaser's expense. Smaller lots of bulbs will be sent by parcel post, when we are specifically requested to do so, at your risk, and postage must be prepaid.

TRADE PACKETS contain liberal quantities in proportion with the price per ounce, and are sent on all orders when packets are wanted, unless otherwise specified. Where smaller quantities than Trade Packets are desired. Retail Packets may be ordered at a discount of 33 1-3 per cent from retail prices.

Simply place the bulb in a dish, bowl, saucer, or on the table or window sill in a little light and watch its beauty unfold. As the blooms fade and drop, cut them off and others will follow in quick succession, each bulb producing from six to fifteen flowers.

When the blooming has ceased, the bulbs may be potted or planted in the open garden or lawn, where the following spring they will develop a beautiful broad, deep-colored foliage.

Remove from bed about July 1st, dry the bulb in the darkness for a few weeks, and use for indoor decoration as at first.

These bulbs are very useful for border planting and can be planted out in the open ground after they are through blooming. If planted in fertile soil they will reproduce themselves each year and will make an attractive display of flowers in the fall.

LILIES

Most Lilies form two sets of roots—one set below and the other above the bulb. For best effects place the bulbs in clumps of six or more, with at least an inch of sand beneath, over, and around each one, then cover with soil. Lilies love ample drainage. Good results have been obtained by digging a hole in the garden deep enough to allow the placing of a 6-inch flower pot, inverted, therein and filling in around the pot with sand or gravel. Plant your bulb on top of the inverted pot and see that the top of the bulb is at least 6 inches below the surface. This would mean that the hole would have to be at least 14 inches deep. Although these Lilies are generally known as hardy, it is advisable to cover the surface with leaves or litter in late fall as a protective measure against frost.
