PLANTING INSTRUCTIONS

File for Future Reference.

1. Plant quality trees only, which are sold by Carol Plantations, Inc., Theodore, Alabama.
2. Keep roots moist and covered until planted.
3. Dig hole at least 6 inches deeper and wider than roots of tree.
4. Trim all broken roots to leave a smooth surface.
5. Tree should be planted same depth as it stood in nursery, or slightly higher.
6. Spread all roots in natural position.
7. Use only well pulverized top soil around roots.
8. Tamp soil around roots firmly as placed in hole.
9. Whenever possible pour water on roots as planted to settle soil around them.
10. Never use fertilizer in planting trees unless it be well mixed with soil.
11. Fertilizer should be given in 3 small applications annually; first, Feb. 15 to Mar. 1; second and third applications 45 and 90 days thereafter.
12. Spread fertilizer in circle under outer branches and slightly beyond, then rake in.
13. Success now depends on care given trees, main essential being FREQUENT SHALLOW cultivation.
