THE PLANTING SEASON

The Spring Planting Season begins as soon as the frost is out of the ground (middle of March to first of April) and continues until the new growth starts—late May or early June.



SHIPPING DIRECTIONS

We are admirably situated for prompt shipping in all directions by rail. Good motor roads enable us to ship by motor truck, within a radius of 75 miles, at a moderate charge, provided the order is large enough to make a truck-load.

Customers are requested to state explicitly the mode of conveyance by which they desire their orders forwarded.

When no route or method is specified we exercise our judgment. In no case do we assume any responsibility after goods have been shipped, except for our own mistakes.

1. The articles herein listed will be furnished according to the following schedule:

1 to 4 plants of the same kind and size will be priced at the each rate.

5 to 39 plants of the same kind and size will be priced at the ten rate.

40 or more plants of the same kind and size will be priced at the hundred rate when a hundred rate is listed.

250 or more plants of the same kind and size will be priced at the thousand rate when a thousand rate is listed.

FROM THIS SCHEDULE WE WILL NOT VARY because of the expense entailed in assembling an order made up of small lots of a kind.

2. Specimens personally selected by the purchaser or his representative (or specially selected by us at the request of the purchaser) will be priced according to their individual values.

3. The prices annexed are for the stock F.O.B. our freight station, or express company.

4. The prices in this list cancel those in all previous lists.

TERMS OF PAYMENT

Our terms are cash, except by special agreement. EVERGREEN TREES

We grow our evergreens with the greatest care. Not only do we prune the tops for shape, but we also PRUNE the ROOTS, and TRANSPLANT the trees many times. This results in a mass of fibrous roots which is the deciding factor in the successful planting of evergreens. For this reason our evergreens should not be confused with quickly and cheaply grown, non-pruned and non-transplanted stock.

We also dig our evergreens with a ball of the earth in which they are grown, and wrap the ball securely in burlap. This we do WITHOUT ADDITIONAL CHARGE.

QUALITY NURSERY STOCK

Experience has proved that it is unprofitable to plant any but the best grade of Nursery Stock. The cost of transportation, the cost of planting and after care—whether paid in money or in physical effort—are too great to lay out on plants that will fail to fulfill their purpose and which will require that the work be done over in a short while.

At the most, the initial saving in buying poorly grown stock is small—in any case less than the cost of buying new plants and the cost of replanting.
