The finest and best keeping onions are grown from the seed. Use one ounce seed to 100 feet of row, 5 to 6 pounds per acre in 12 to 18 inch rows, plants 4 to 5 inches apart. If seed are planted in bed, transplant when as large as a pencil. Plant in September, October and November. Make the ground as rich as possible for onions: it cannot be made too rich.






