Order Early. Send in your orders as soon as possible after receiving catalog to insure prompt delivery. All orders are filled the same day they are received, as far as practicable.
Bulbs. At prices quoted, 25 or more of one variety are supplied at the 100 rate, while 250 or more will be supplied at 1000 rate. Less than 25 of one variety will be supplied only at an increased price of $10 \%$ over 100 rates. The extra cost of labor in filling small orders is considerable, hence the increase in price necessary.
