

Conditions of Sale

Order Early. Send in your orders as soon as possible after receiving catalog to insure prompt delivery. All orders are filled the same day they are received, as far as practicable.

Bulbs. At prices quoted, 25 or more of one variety are supplied at the 100 rate, while 250 or more will be supplied at 1000 rate. Less than 25 of one variety will be supplied only at an increased price of 10% over 100 rates. The extra cost of labor in filling small orders is considerable, hence the increase in price necessary.

Errors. We exercise the utmost care in filling orders, striving to do a little more than we offer; yet, in the press of business, errors sometimes occur in which event I wish to be promptly notified of the fact, and I will make such corrections as will be satisfactory. Please keep copies of all your orders for comparison.

ALL Accounts are strictly due thirty days from date of invoice; 2 per cent for cash is allowed for payments within ten days: 5 per cent if cash accompanies order.






