I^T is not necessary to use specimen grades for mass planting, screens, hedges, etc. We have a special grade for this purpose in fine Nursery grown Evergreens—perfectly healthy and hardy and all twice or more times transplanted (except where noted)—These trees have good fibrous roots and are shipped without ball of earth, carefully packed in wet moss, unless otherwise requested.
