E are strictly growers and do not buy any stock. Everything we offer is grown right here in New Brunswick.

Our roses are 2 year field grown, budded on JAPANESE MULTIFLORA, the best stock for the greater part of the U. S. It positively will not "sucker."

We winter our roses in unheated sheds with the roots in the ground and the tops in the air. This makes a hardy top for spring planting. Whenever possible, we favor Fall planting.

Roses require a good deal of moisture, even when dormant, and much trouble can be traced to lack of water. After you receive your roses, if it is intended to sell them dormant, they are best heeled in deeply, protected from wind and severe temperature changes and kept shaded and well watered.






BELLADONNA, Pfitzer's Improved Strain, a really worthwhile improvement over the ordinary. The plants grow taller and the flowers and spikes are larger.




Typical Spikes of Our Hybrid Delphiniums
