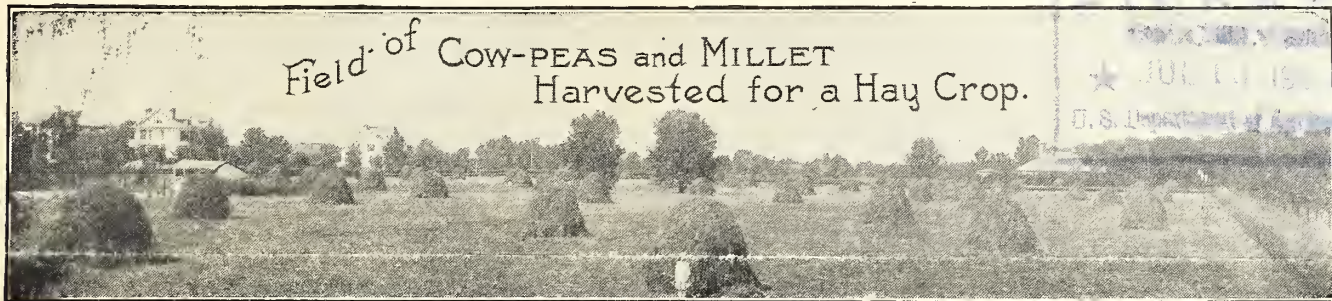

GERMAN MILLET makes hay in about sixty days. A quick growing COW PEA, such as the New Era, is sown with it—three pecks of millet to a bushel of peas will plant an acre.

Abandonment of Wheat Acreage Increases Demand for Summer Crops

FOR planting on the plowed-up wheat lands, Soja Beans will undoubtedly take first place. In Illinois 60 per cent of the wheat area is plowed up and contracts are secured for 50,000 acres to be planted for the soy bean mills. In the Kansas City territory one financier has expressed willingness to finance ten mills. During 1927 the mills in North Carolina used around 500,000 bushels for oil purposes.

Soja Beans have been grown successfully on practically every kind of soil—rich and poor, sweet and sour, heavy and light, drained and undrained. They will not grow when sown in cold, wet weather, but when planted at the right time may be depended on to make some sort of a crop under any circumstances.

The Missouri College of Agriculture has found the Virginia the best for either hay or seed on medium land, the Wilson the best on good land. These two are the varieties for hay under all conditions. The Haberlandt is recommended as the best for hogging down or to use for the silo. As Virginia, northern North Carolina, West Virginia and Maryland are in the same latitude as Missouri and tests made by the Virginia Experiment Station also showed the Virginia, Wilson and Haberlandt to be the most desirable for yields of hay and seed, a farmer planting for either purpose in this section need have no hesitation in selecting one of these three.

In Pennsylvania the Virginia and Haberlandt matured seed in 136 days; the Wilson in 133 days. At Blacksburg, Va., the Virginia and Wilson matured seed in 131 days; the Haberlandt in 133 days. At West Raleigh, N. C., the Virginia matured seed in 117 days, Wilson in 114 days, and Haberlandt in 112 days.

TIMELY SUGGESTIONS FOR MAY AND JUNE PLANTING

SEED CORN

Field Varieties—Boone County or Reid's Yellow Dent.

For Ensilage—Wood's Pamunkey or Coker's Prolific Ensilage.

The above are the best and most productive strains for late planting.

SEED POTATOES

Most gardeners are planting potatoes each year in June or July for winter use. The varieties that pay best, planted in these months, are Virginia Grown Irish Cobbler, Maine Grown Green Mountain and McCormick. These are the surest croppers, and the last named is particularly dependable on rather poor land, and in an unusually dry season.

SUDAN GRASS

This year's shortage of pasturage, estimated by the U. S. Government at over 23 per cent, together with this summer's larger demand for hay, points out Sudan Grass as a crop to plant for certain profit. Besides yielding two or more heavy cuttings of hay, for which it has outstanding value, it has shown real worth as grazing for dairy cattle. Careful tests in Kansas showed the milk production to be decidedly improved each time the cows were taken off fields of native grasses and returned to sudan.

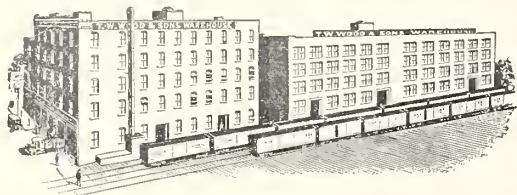
