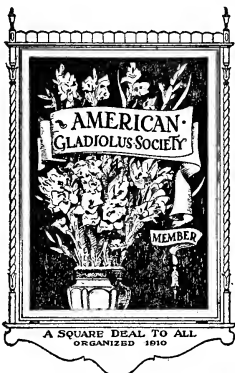

## General Information

## The Gladiolus and Its Culture

In addition to their great beauty, the gladioli are becoming more popular on account of their ease of culture.

The gladiolus will thrive in almost any good garden soil, but seems at its best in soils that are more or less sandy. Plant in a sunny location away from trees or large shrubs. The gladiolus will not do well in a location that does not receive sunshine the greater part of the day.

Well rotted cow or horse manures are the best fertilizers to use on average soils. Fresh manure should not be used unless it has been worked into the soil the fall before planting time. Well balanced fertilizer may be used to an advantage if used as a top dressing and worked into the ground at planting time. Generally speaking handle your soil for planting exactly the same as for vegetable growing.

Plant the bulbs in furrows about 4 inches deep and six inches apart in the row. The rows should be 18 inches or more apart so as to make it more convenient for cultivation. Cultivate well and often so as to conserve moisture and keep weeds down. Give the same care you would for a well cared for garden, although they will respond to less care than any other flower.

The first planting may be made in the spring as soon as the ground is warm and in good workable condition. If a succession of blooms are desired throughout the summer, new plantings may be made about ten days after the foliage of the previous planting shows through the ground, and additional plantings continued until the last week in June which is about as late as it is safe to make the last planting in order to secure flowers before frost.

If the flowers are intended for indoor use, the spike may be cut as soon as first bud opens. The balance of the buds will open when placed in water, almost to the tip of the stalk. If a small part of the bottom of the stalk is cut off each day and fresh water used, they will last a week or ten days.

Care must be used when cutting the spike so as to leave as much foliage as possible on the plant. This is necessary if the bulb is intended to be saved and planted another season. The bulbs may be dug up as soon as the foliage shows signs of turning brown or are hit by a hard frost. Cut the stems close to the bulb as soon as lifted and allow the bulbs to dry in the sun two or three days before storing. Any place suitable for storing potatoes will do well. The old corm and roots may be removed as soon as they separate easily.
