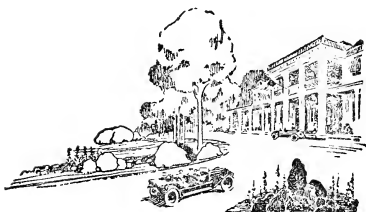

Roses, small shrubs and gladiolus bulbs are post-paid to New Jersey, New York and New England. Add 10% for postage to further points.

GUARANTEE

All stock is guaranteed true to name. Should it prove false, it will be replaced free of charge. Owing to the low prices that we quote herein we can not replace nursery stock that dies, entirely free of charge, however, we will replace dead stock at one half the purchase price.

Complaints for incomplete or erroneous shipments must be made within ten days from shipping date, otherwise no allowance will be made.
