## INTRODUCTION

The Forest Nursery Company started growing and shipping nursery stock in 1887, and has operated contiruously since that time. The founder, the late J. H. H. Boyd, outlined the policies governing the activities at that time, these policies were approved by the hundreds of customers of those early days, who, for more than a quarter of a century, have continued to purchase their requirements in nursery stock from us each year. For many years Messrs. F. C. and J. R. Boyd, sons of the founder, have personally managed the business and adhered to the policies, which have made the firm so well and favorably known. All stock is carefuily grown where soil and climate are the most favoraple, dug with good root system and properly handied.

LOCATION-McMinnville is located in Middle Tennessee on N. C. \& St. L Railroad. Is, also, located on State Highway No. 1, a hard surfaced highway through the state. iviany who visit our nursery prefer to take bus from Nashville to McMinnville. These busses make fiequent trips every day. Our packing house and office are located just South of the depot.

SHIPPING SEASON-We usually begin digging and shipping in latter part of October, and we continue almost every day throughout the winter and up until latter part of April. Full shipping instructions should be given with every order as to how shipment is to be made, whether Freight, Express or Parcel Post. When no instructions are given, we use our best judgment.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS-This list cancels all previous quotations. Conditions always exist over which we have no control, and it is understood that in case of error on our part, or in the event that damage is caused to the stock by any unforseen conditions, such as hail, fire, drought, etc., that we shall not be liable for a greater amount than the original price paid for the stock.
