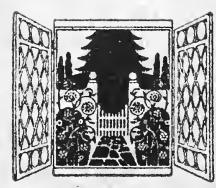

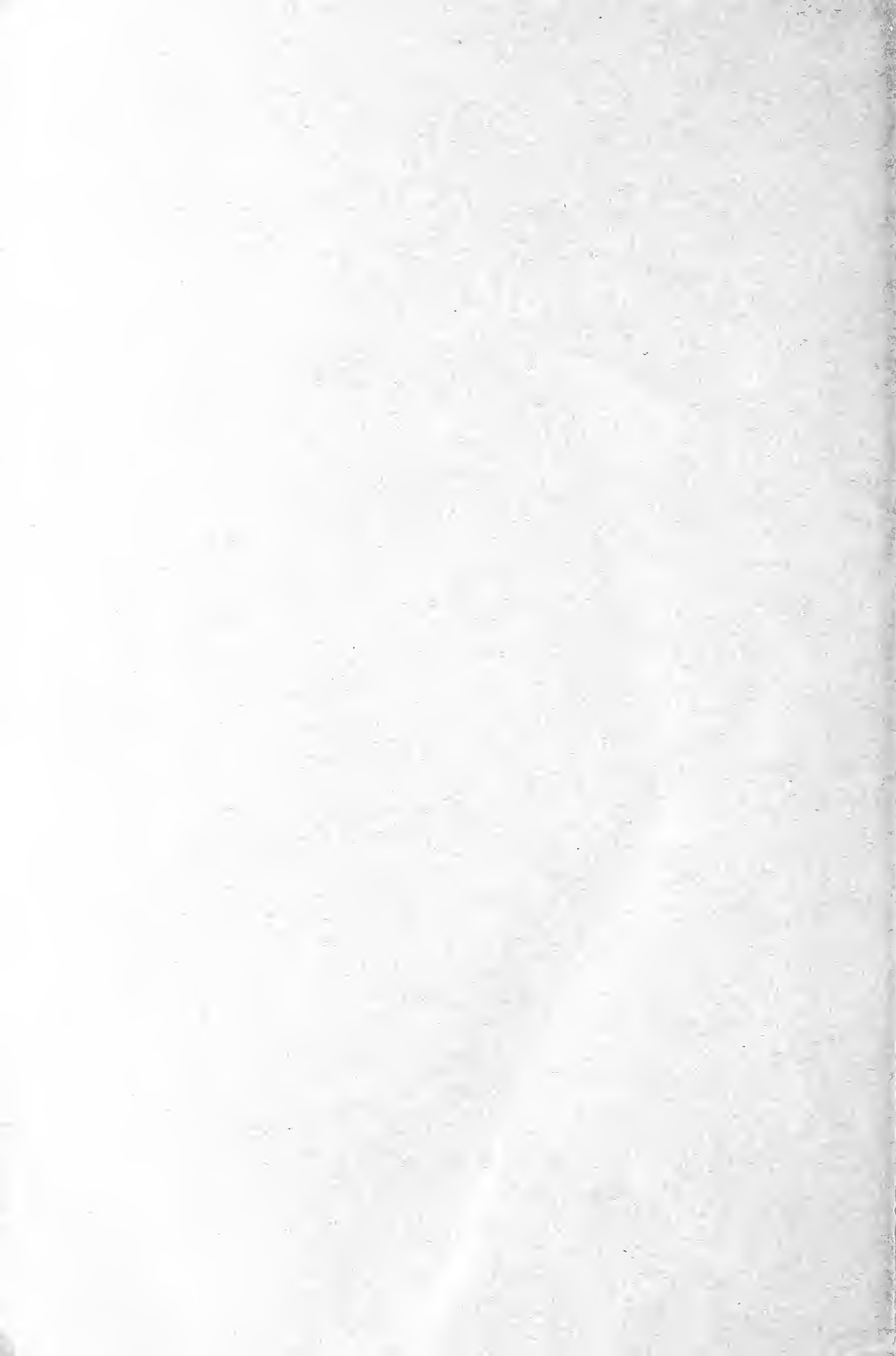

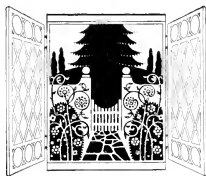

# Tulips

## CULTURE OUTDOORS

If soil is loosened about 12 inches deep before planting, and if possible mixed with leaf mold or well-rotted stable manure, the best results can be expected. Tulips should be planted 4 inches below the surface of the ground. Cover them after the ground is frozen. Remove covering in the spring, when the tips are about 4 inches high.
