Hardy Pompon. Very early, ready to cut October 15th. Light Daybreak pink; when mature, pearly white; the form of flower is very perfect; sprays fine for bunching, stems of good length.

GOLDEN CLIMAX—

A very pleasing shade of bright yellow; medium size and height.

CAPTAIN COOK—

Tall in growth, color a lovely shade of rose-pink, free from lavender tones. Makes a prime commercial "bunch". Second early.

CHRISTMAS GOLD

—This variety is a small golden yellow and does not flower until December, making a very valuable late flower sort.

CLARA JAMESON

(New.)—Lovely combination of bronze and scarlet. Very showy; the tones of color always in demand in Pompons; immense producer. Early flowering variety.

DIANA—

The most beautiful of white Pompons, pure in color, of full, fluffy form; very early; extremely useful to every grower of cut flowers.

FLORA—

Bright crimson with scarlet shading; much the color of Jules La Gravere and a free, easy grower with good stems and full sprays. Midseason.

LILLIA—

Tall, stiff stem; good sized flowers freely produced; grand red color.

LILIAN DOTY—

It is much the finest pink in the large flowered section of the entire Pompon family. The plant is a tremendous grower and will make stems four and five feet long, producing beautiful sprays of clear, light pink flowers.

MARIANA (New.)—

Large flowered and snow-white, on long, stiff stem; when grown to a single stem, it is absolutely perfect; can be disbudded five or six flowers to a plant.

NEW YORK—

Coming into flower November 1, this bronze variety has been the most called for of any of the many sorts we have been growing. First of a wonderful succession of bronze Pompons.

ROMAINE WARREN—

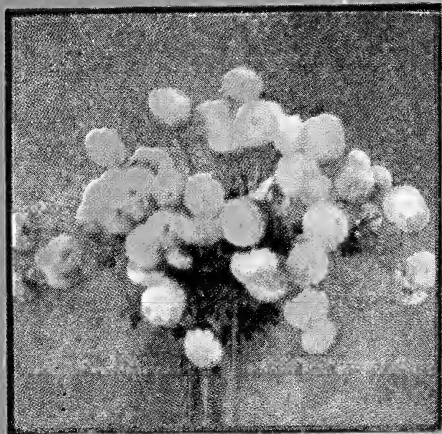
A distinct variety, with handsome sprays which reveal each flower individually. Color orange-yellow and light bronze, completing with a dark orange center.

SKIBO—

Golden button; only true Pompon in this class. Immensely productive, showy, and long lasting.

WESTERN BEAUTY—

Deep rose-pink in color; flower medium sized, throwing straight stems which hold the flowers erect. It will follow the variety Fairy Queen and comes as a welcome addition at a time when there are no pink Pompons. It blooms from November 10 to 25.

King Edward Daisies

(Hardy. Grows 24 in. Plant in sunny location. Blooms June to October.) The plants are very tall, well branched, with fine cut foliage and huge white flowers borne in profusion on long stiff stems. The flowers are pure white with gold centers; petals very long and center soft and velvety.

Gold Medal Hybrids

Vigorous, free blooming with flower spikes 2 feet long. Grand assortment of colors ranging from lightest blue to purple.

Digitalis

Pink, Purple and White.

(**Foxglove.**)—The Foxgloves, old-fashioned, dignified and stately, are wholesome company in any garden.

Physalia Francheti

(**Japanese Lantern Plant.**)

The most wonderful vine for home decoration in the fall. Sprays of these vines, covered with their orange colored lanterns, looking as if lighted candles were inside, can be draped over mantels, portieres, giving an oriental effect that is charming.

Physostegia Virginica
