Contrary to popular opinion, perhaps, the Single in practically all varieties produce those handsome, large, compact trusses that many assume to be double, but erroneously. Naturally some sorts are more compact than others, but we have no fear whatever but that those kinds we offer will give excellent results.

The varieties we offer have been carefully selected from the extensive list grown by those alert Hollanders. Inferior varieties have been culled out, so that our list may be depended upon for satisfaction. We recommend them without reserve.

We do not advise forcing more than one color or variety in a single pot, because each has its own peculiar characteristic habit of growth and time of flowering. For an overwhelming effect, try 12 to 15 bulbs of the second size in a single pan.
