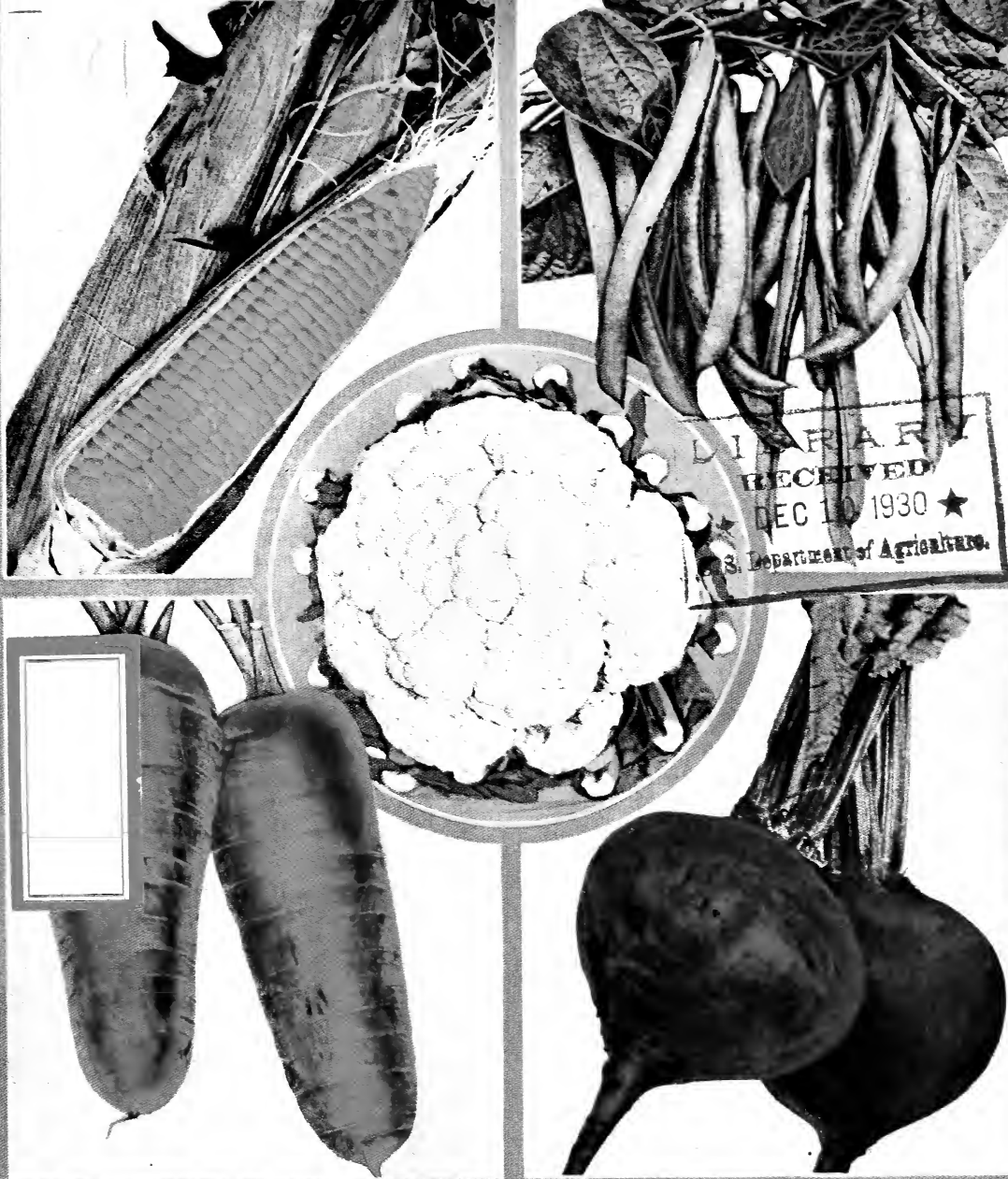

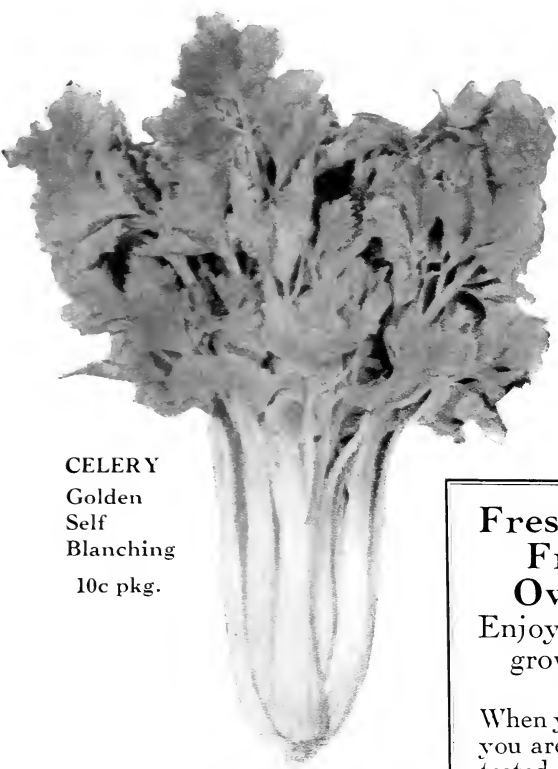

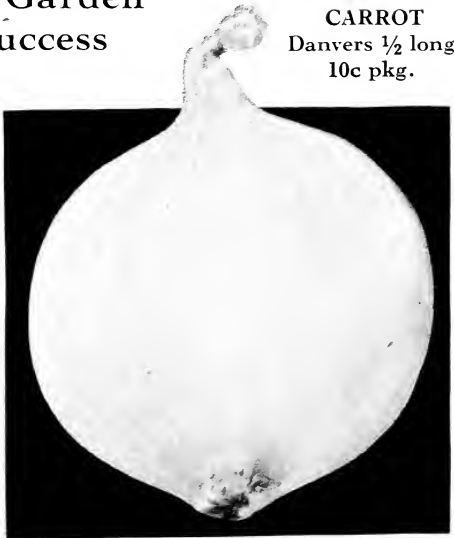

TERMS

Our Terms are Strictly Cash with the Order. We do not send C. O. D., as the cost of collecting return charges is quite an unnecessary item of expense and the prices being given, we can conceive of no necessity to warrant goods being so sent.

HOW TO SEND MONEY

Remittances may be made at our risk by any of the following methods, viz: **Postal Money Order, Draft on New York or Chicago, or Express Company's Money Orders, or cash by Registered Letter.** We accept clean postage stamps the same as cash in amounts of \$1.00 or less.

The rates charged for Postal Money Orders and Express Money Orders are now so low that these are the best way to remit. We will bear the expense of sending money in either of these ways. Deduct the cost of the order from amount sent, Express Money Orders can be obtained at all offices of the principal Express Companies. They are cheap and absolutely safe.

There are hundreds of contingencies continually arising to prevent the best seeds always giving satisfaction, such as sowing too deep, too shallow, in too wet or too dry soil; insects of all descriptions destroying the plants as soon as or before they appear; wet weather, cold weather, frosts, chemical changes in the seeds induced by temperature, etc. For the above reasons it is impracticable to guarantee seeds under all circumstances.

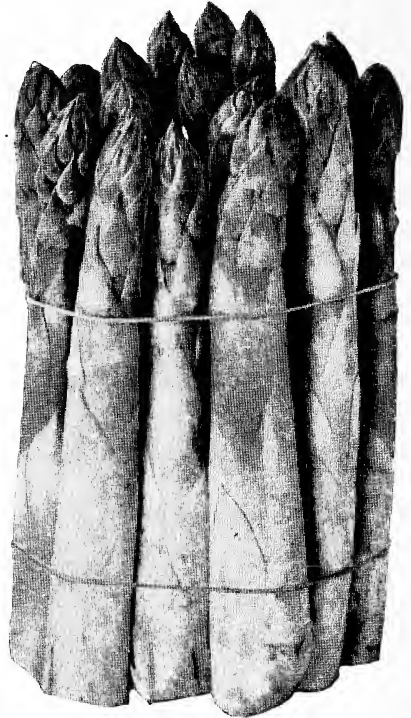

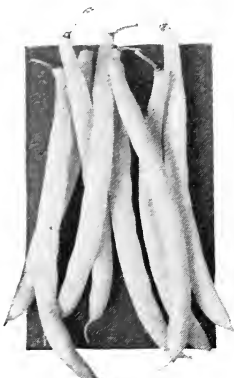

Table Beets

One package will sow 15 ft. of row, 1 oz. 50 ft., 5 to 6 lbs. to the acre.

The best results are obtained on a deep, rich sandy loam. Sow seed 1 inch deep, in drills 16 inches apart, as early as possible. If wanted very early, sow Detroit Dark Red and Crosby's Egyptian in hotbeds and transplant to open ground. Thin to stand 3 to 4 inches apart. Cultivate cleanly and thoroughly. For succession, sow at intervals until middle of July.

SUGAR BEETS AND MANGELS

(For Stock)

There is no crop more valuable for feeding cattle and sheep than mangels and sugar beets. In these last few years it's hard to find a dairyman who does not feed them. 45 tons to the acre is the average yield, they are easily harvested, not a particle of waste to them, and may be stored in pits and root cellar with little trouble. Sow 8 lbs. to the acre in May or June in drills 2 ft. apart, and thin to 10 inches in the row.

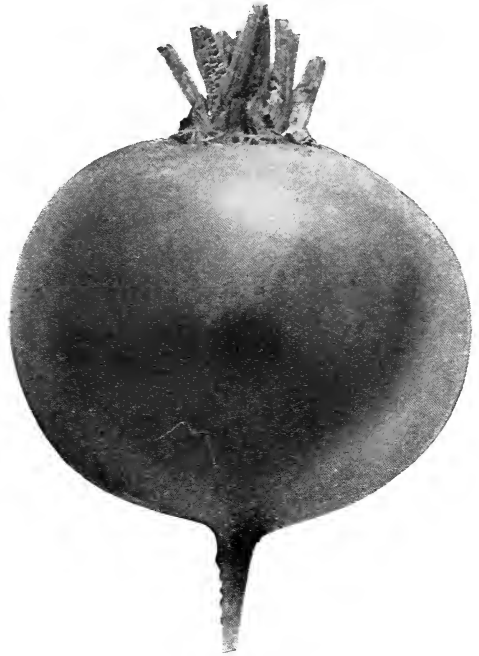

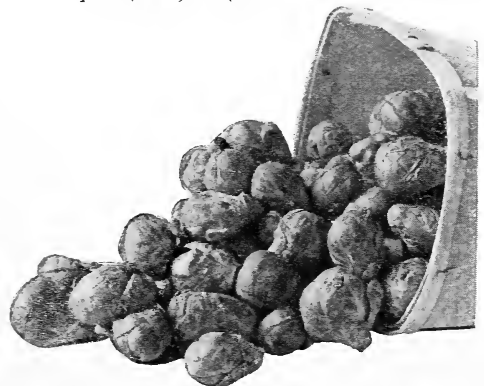

The seed we offer is absolutely new stock from the best professional growers. A heavy, moist, rich loam, thoroughly cultivated, highly manured and worked deep is most suitable to Cabbage. Early Cabbage should be started under glass in March, and transplanted 24 inches apart in rows 2 feet apart as soon as ground outside can be prepared.

For late plants, sow in drills in open ground in May; transplant in July. Protect against insects by dusting with Slug Shot.

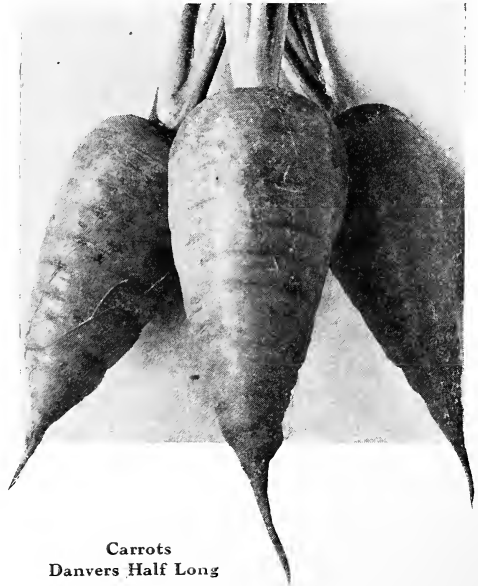

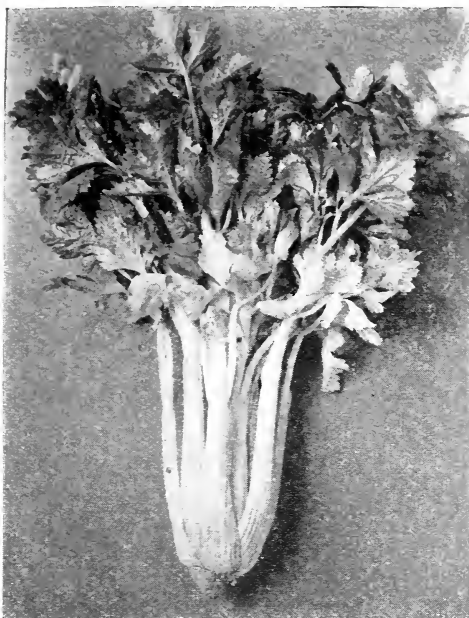

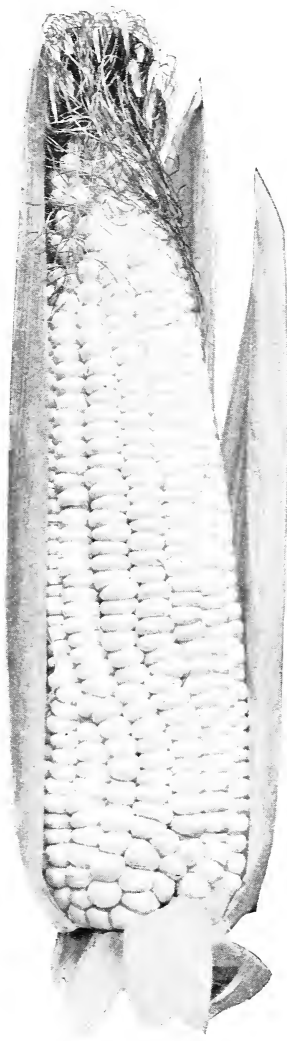

Cucumbers

One package will plant 15 hills, one ounce 50 hills,
2 to 3 lbs. an acre

Cucumbers should be raised in every home-garden. They can be grown to perfection with ordinary care. Plant seed when danger from frost is over, an inch deep in hills, 4 to 6 feet apart each way, dropping 8 to 10 seeds in a hill. When second set of leaves have formed, thin to four plants to a hill. Cultivate thoroughly until runners make this impossible. If plants are attacked by beetles, spray with Bordeaux or Arsenate of Lead. Always wash fruits thoroughly before eating when these sprays are used. If foliage is attacked underneath, spray with Black-Leaf 40.

One of the best salads for fall and winter use, for garnishing and for flavoring soups and stews. Sow in shallow drills, 15 inches apart; thin plants to one foot apart. For early use sow in April; for late use, in June or July. When full grown tie outer leaves together over center to blanch heart of plant. By covering fresh plants every few days, a succession may be kept up.

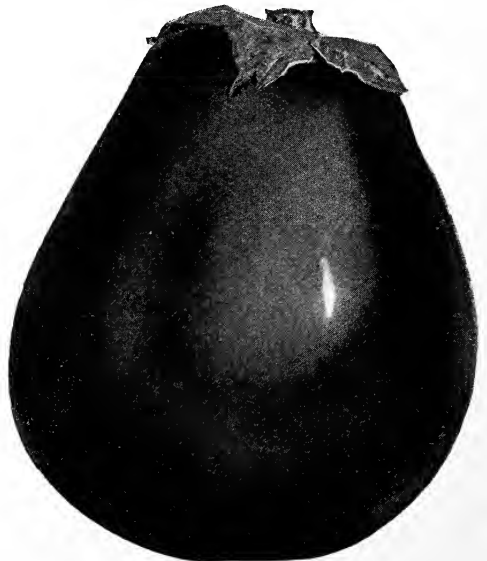

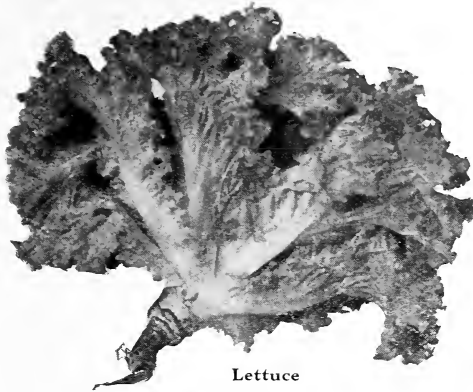

LETTUCE

For extra early plants, sow seed in February or March in hot-beds; transplant to open ground in April. Lettuce, to be at its best, should grow rapidly. Soil should be made as rich as possible by fertilizing and thorough preparation. For main garden crop, sow seed outdoors in a warm spot in the gardens, as early in spring as possible, in rows 18 inches apart. The way to raise good heads of lettuce is to thin them out when they are an inch high so they will stand 8 inches apart in the row. Fresh lettuce can be had all season by sowing at intervals of two weeks.

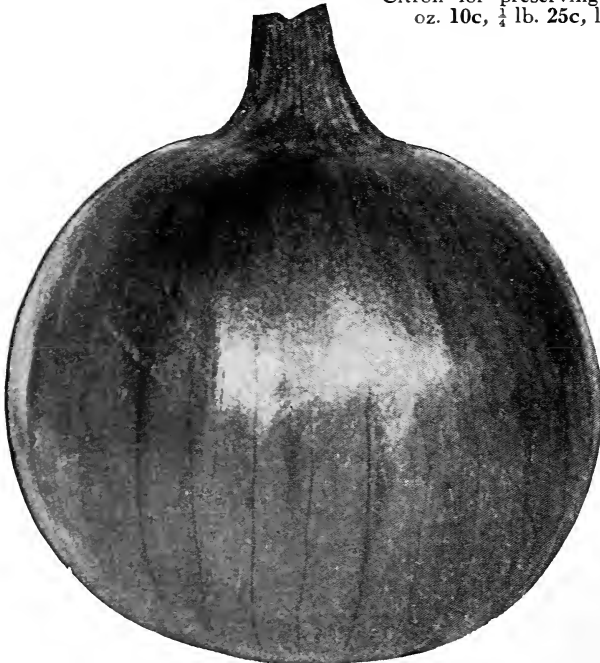

Saul's Radish

This is another vegetable that loses about half its flavor if not eaten within a very short time after it is taken from the ground. Radishes wilt, like flowers and other vegetables, and lose their fresh crispness and juicy, delicate flavor. You can't know how really good radishes are if you haven't gone out in the garden in the early morning and pulled a few for your breakfast.

For forcing, sow in hotbed or under glass in rich, sandy loam. Scatter 50 to 100 seeds to the foot and cover with $\frac{1}{2}$ inch of soil sifted on. Sow in garden, as early as possible, in rows about 12 inches apart and thin to prevent crowding. A good dressing of nitrate of soda will greatly help their growth and make them tender and crisp. Successive sowings every week or 10 days will keep your table well supplied the entire season.

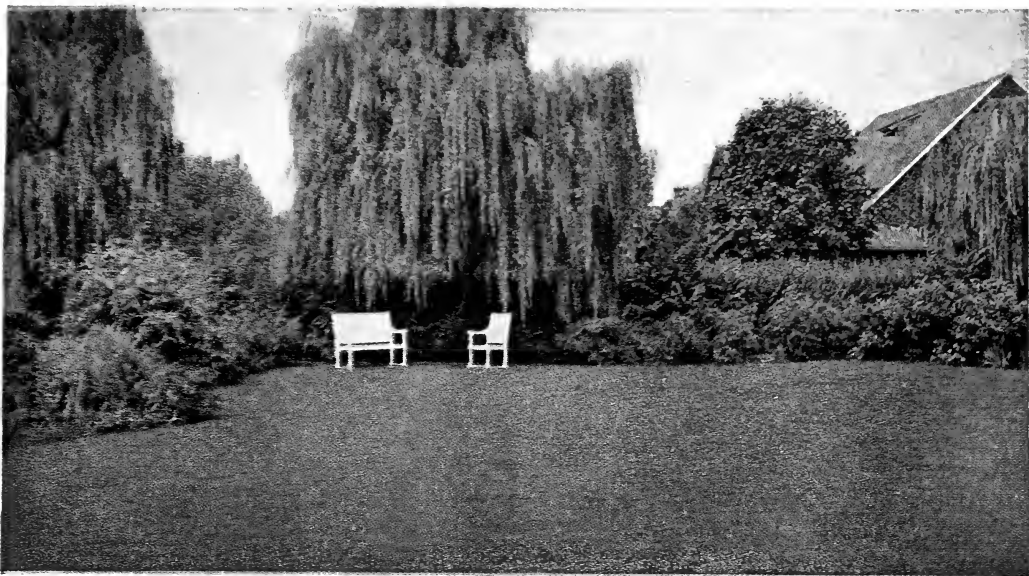

Saul's Lawn Grass Seed

To have a fine lawn it is essential to give particular attention to the preparation of the soil, light and fine on the surface, proper drainage and fertilizing (the best lawn fertilizer should be used), rolling, and selection of seed that will produce a short, velvety appearance during the entire season, from Spring until late in the Fall.

As some grasses are more luxuriant in spring, others in summer, others in autumn, it is necessary to exercise the greatest care and caution in selecting a mixture that will produce the above velvety appearance.

From the middle of March to the middle of May is the most favorable time to sow lawn seed.

It can also be sown in the Fall, but must be sown early enough to give the young grass a chance to become well established before the Winter sets in.

The lawn should be gone over with a heavy roller every Spring, as Winter frosts loosen the soil, and rolling is necessary to compress it again.

No lawn is beautiful without frequent rolling and mowing.

Lawn Seed should be sown when the ground is moist, or before a rainfall, at the rate of one pound to every square rod

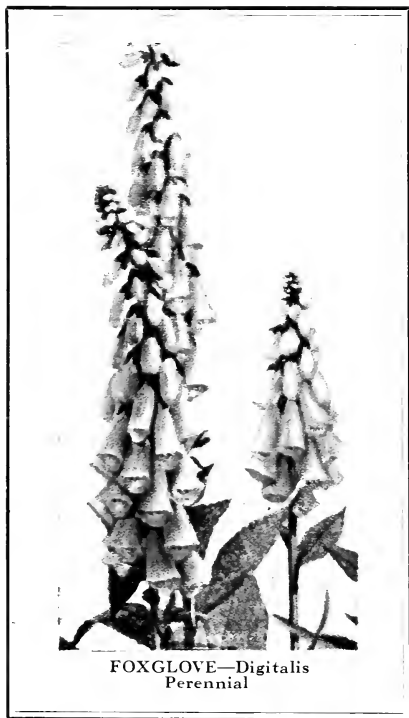

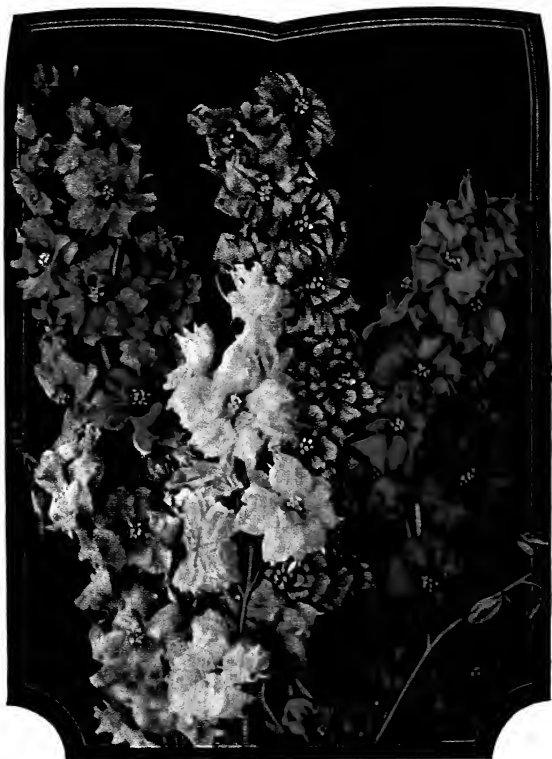
