Gaillardia Portola Hybrids

Gaillardia

Portola Hybrids. This hardy perennial is of strong, vigorous, erect habit of growth, from 2½ to 3 ft. high; the stems are strong, and stiff, holding the flowers erect; these are of large size, nearly 4 inches in diameter, the petals being very broad and over-lapping, of great substance, and spread out flat, forming a very regular flower; in color a brilliant scarlet with coppery hue which is intensified by the golden yellow with which each petal is heavily tipped. Comes about 50% true from seed. Pkt. 10c.

Japanese Pinks

Nothing can equal these old fashioned garden pinks in display of gorgeous beauty and profusion of blooms. They are not particular as to soil and location, yet a fairly heavy and fertile soil produce large and stocky plants which is fairly loaded with flowers during late summer and fall. The flowers are large and double and embrace various shades, colors and markings such as flesh, pink, light and deep rose, scarlet, crimson and maroon. Pkt. 10c.

Lilies

With a well selected situation, lilies may be had in bloom from June to October. They can be planted in the fall, from October first as long as the soil can be worked, and in the spring till the first of May. Plant about five inches deep. Protect over winter with a good covering of leaves or straw.

The Regal Lily. (Regale or Myriophyllum.) A novelty of unusual merit. Experiments prove this new lily to be hardier than most kinds. The flowers are white slightly suffused with pink; with a beautiful glow of canary yellow at the center which continues part way up the trumpet. Its perfume is exquisite; not oppressively heavy like some types but the sweet fragrance of the jasmine. In the garden it should bloom early in July. It is admirably adapted for blooming in the house during winter. Do not fail to include this wonderful lily in your order. 30c each; 2 for 50c.

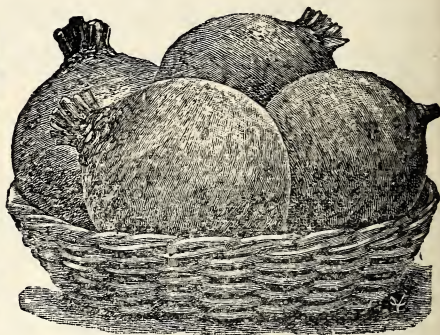

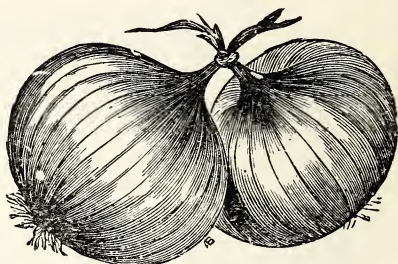
