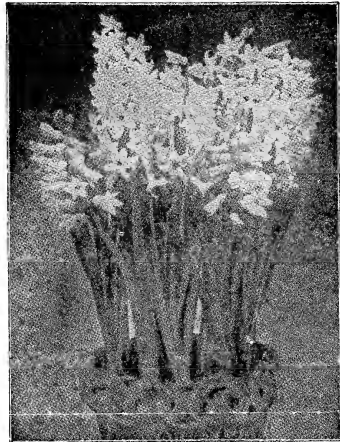

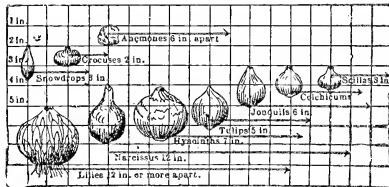

We consider it advisable when the ground is thoroughly moist after you have placed your mulch on the same to cover the entire bed up with boards or roofing paper, so as to prevent it from getting very wet in the Winter and then freezing and thawing.

For inside use, plant your bulbs in light sandy soil, firming them well in the soil with crown of bulb below the surface. Give them thorough watering; then plunge the pots in the cellar to a depth of 3 or 4 in. above the pot and again water thoroughly. Examine them occasionally and if they become dry give them a thoro watering, keeping them buried 4 to 6 weeks till they are started. Then remove them to the light and grow cool. Do not bring them to the light until they are thoroughly rooted and started and do not put them in a hot, sunny place, as this will have a tendency to make short inferior blooming stalks. A light, cool sunny window is best for the growing of all bulbs in the home. Hyacinths will have longer spikes if grown in the shade. It is often advisable to turn a pot or paper sack upside down over them for two weeks after bringing to the light to make them stretch. They should be up at least 3 to 4 inches before exposing to full light.

How to Plant Your Bulbs

A careful study of the engraving will show you the exact depth and distance to plant your bulbs outside. Spade your ground up well—good and deep—well pulverized and rich. Then smooth off the soil and firm with brick or board. By using a round stick a little larger than the bulb you are planting, you can easily make holes the right size and depth. Drop your bulb in right side up, fill the hole and again pack solid firm and give thorough watering when the ground is dry outside.

When the ground freezes in the Fall give a thorough mulch, leaving same on all Winter and gradually remove in the Spring.

TENDER VARIETIES

For early blooming and for growing in pebbles and water.

PAPER WHITE NARCISSUS—These beautiful, graceful Narcissus will flower as early as Christmas. The flower is larger than the Chinese Lily. Planted in earth use 6 to 8 bulbs in a 6-inch pan, which started in September will flower by Christmas. Very easily grown. 3 for 25c, 80c per dozen. Grow in cool sunny window and keep away from cold as least frost will blight bulbs—if grown too warm they become lumpy. 6c each; 65c per dozen.

SOLEIL DE OR—Similar to Paper White but flowers are pure yellow, easily forced or grown in water, 15c each, 12 for \$1.50.

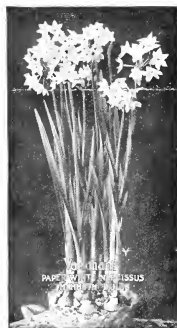

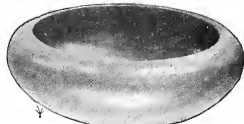
