FORMAL AND INFORMAL DECORATIVE DAHLIAS

ARCTIC SHADOWS (Harding)

This a Mammoth pure white blossom shading to palest mauve carried on long, straight stem, vigorous grower.

ASBURY PARK (Wood-Burpee)

A marvelous Dahlia of extreme size, autumn coloring—bright Strawberry red, flushed with salmon and tinted with old gold toward the tip of the petals.

DR. JOHN H. CARMEN (Dixon)

A large, deep, broad petaled flower of rich tyrian-rose tipped petunia and silver, carried on stiff stems.
