**Glory of The Garden** Roses — The

It is a common saying that the love of flowers is univer-sal and considering that the tendency of the age seems to be to subdivide occupations and interests, it is not surprising that many of us should find practically all of our leisure time given to the study and cultivation of flowers. The stress of common life finds much relaxation in the flower garden which affords life finds much relaxation in the flower garden which allords varied interest, exercise and pleasure the year around, and then we find there is much encouragement in the work of one's own hands. Not only does personal work make one's garden seem better and more attractive, but out of it develops a keen in-terest in comparison and competition. It is a happy thought for us all that out of the smallest plot of ground one can raise the fine the formut. the finest flowers that can be grown.

Roses are grown more largely perhaps than any other class of plants, and for this reason the best methods of culture should be widely disseminated. They are grown in vast numbers un-der glass in winter, but the greater part by far are planted out for summer blooming.

When Shipment Is Received When plants are received it is will to give careful attention to the protection of the roots until they are planted. Drying of the roots by winds is fatal. Dipping the roots, or "puddling" as it is called, in a thin slushy mud is an advantage and thoroughly protects the roots from the air. When setting the plants in the ground see that the soil is firmed about them well and protect the plants from the direct rays of the sun for a couple of days. When pot plants are purchased with full ball of earth, protection from the sun is not wholly necessary. Water thoroughly after you have made the planting, then cultivate regularly. (See our book, "How to Grow All Kinds of Plants," 35c).

Planting And The Soil Roses must be planted in the right manner to secure any degree of success. They should never be planted where they will be shaded too much, and they should always be provided with good drainage. Under trees is no place for them, nor among shrubbery. The best place is in a well-drained part of the garden where they get the sun during the whole morning and partly in the afternoon. The Rose, as well as all other plants, must have plenty of sun in order to produce flowers, and this fact should never be lost sight of in planting. Naturally damp, soggy ground should never the soil is inclined to be poor, the addition of some well-rotted cow or horse manure will be of great benefit. The plants should be set about two feet apart. Plants set out with cramp-d roots never do as well as those having plenty of root room. (See our book, "How to Grow All Kinds of Plants," 350.

Fertilizing The Rose is a very gross feeder, and will consequently require a liberal supply of manure. The best manure is unquestionably farmyard manure. In all cases, the manure should be well decomposed, as fresh manure will burn the roots. Bone meal is an excellent fertilizer. (See our book, "'How to Grow All Kinds of Plants," 35c).

(See our book, "How to Grow All Kinds of Plants," 35c). **Pruning** The object of pruning Roses is to increase their appearance of the plant. Generally speaking, the work is done in the early spring just before the growing season. All weak and old scraggly growth of years previous should be cut out, and old growth that has bloomed a year or more. With old-fashioned Roses, such as Harrison's Yellow, etc., which flower on the old wood of previous season's growth (similar to some hardy shrubs), the pruning should be done right after the flow-ering season. (See our book, "How to Grow All Kinds of Plants," 35c).

Winter Protection The Roses we offer may be divided into the following classes

st-HYBRID TEAS—Monthly Blooming or Everblooming Roses or Bush Roses (pages 3-11, inc.). Most of these can be carried through cur winters if the ground is banked around the base of the plants and the tops thatched with straw.


2nd-HYBRID TEA CLIMBERS (page 12)-These come un-der same treatment as the Hybrid Teas.

3rd-HARDY CLIMBERS, HARDY RAMBLERS AND PILLAR ROSES (pages 13, 14 and 15)-All hardy without protection.

4th—HYBRID PERPETUALS AND RUGOSAS—Hardy June Blooming, (pages 16-17)—All hardy without protection. 5th—POLYANTHA, BUSH OR BABY RAMBLER ROSES

5th—POLYANTHA, BUSH OR BABY RAMBLER ROSES (page 18)—All hardy without protection. It is well however to protect all Roses from severe winters. The important point is to keep the ground around the base of the plants dry. The plants should be first covered with rough material of some kind to allow a circulation of air over the surface of the ground, and this rough covering can be topped with leaves, manure or other coarse material such as will shed the winter storms of rain, sleet and snow. Plants in winter should be kept dry for the same reason that we keep ourselves dry. Remember, there is much more in common, or should be, between animal and plant life than is acknowledged by most of those who strive for success in the growing of Roses. One must always remember that both demand for their perfect de-velopment a sufficiency of nourishing food and drink, a pure atmosphere, a temperature as equable as possible, careful pro-tection and thorough cleanliness. 










