We grow our own trees.

Our terms are cash wth the order.

The prices in this list are net on less than \$10.00, f. o. b. here, for express or parcel post. When postage is allowed see table on back page to find amount to send for postage. \$10.00 to \$10.00, we pay express or postage; \$50.00 to \$100.00, we pay express or freight and allow 5% count; \$100.00 or over, we pay express or freight and allow 10% dscount.
