## RECOMMENDED CARE OF PLANTS

We are often asked how much water a pot plant requires. There is no hard and fast rule. Where practical, and particularly in smaller size plants, it is advisable to use a saucer, and water sufficiently from the top until some of the water comes out at the bottom into the saucer. If this water in the saucer has not been absorbed by the next day, you are perfectly safe in not giving the plant any water that day. If it has disappeared, water again. On very hot days, where a pot is small and the foliage of the plant is out of proportion to the size of the pot, a plant of this kind very often requires two waterings a day.
KENTIAS and PHOENIX, particularly in the larger sizes need water and must not be allowed to DRY OUT. Once a week, and preferably twice a week, completely immerse the tub in a pail of water until the bubbles stop coming up from the earth, and daily give the plant water to keep the plant moist but not enough so that the pot or tub is standing in water. It has been found that direct sun rays will turn Palm leaves yellow. This must be considered in placing a plant.

## HOW TO GET TO THE NURSERY FROM NEW YORK

## BY AUTOMOBILE

VIA HOLLAND TUNNEL-Follow main line of traffic on top of viaduct until the road branchesone under viaduct other to right. Go under viaduct until you come out at a police booth; then turn right at signs to Bergen County and points north; continue along route No. 1 (Tonnelle Ave.), turning left at Paterson Plank Road in North Bergen and follow the trolley tracks until you reach the nursery.

23rd ST. ELECTRIC FERRY-Getting off ferry turn right on to East Drive, take first left (Highwood Terrace at 38 th St.), keep going straight, srossing Hudson Boulevard turn right into Bergen Turnpike and next left into Paterson Turnpike; continue along trolley tracks.

42nd ST. FERRY TO WEEHAWKEN-At top of viaduct turn sharp left onto Boulevard East. Turn off Blvd. E. at 23rd St., Electric Ferry signs, going straight ahead onto Highwood Terrace, continue as from 23rd St. Ferry.

125th ST. FERRY TO EDGEWATER-At top of viaduct take N. J. Route No. 5; leave No. 5 at Little Ferry bank on Williams Ave.; when you cross tracks at Teterboro Airport, take first left (Route No. 2) then keep on this to first trolley track which is Paterson Ave., turn right and continue straight ahead to the Nursery.

DYCKMAN ST. FERRY-Take first left (Sylvan Ave.) at top of viaduct, continue and make a right turn at Route No. 5 (125th St. Ferry approach). Continue as from 125th St. Ferry.

YONKERS AND ALPINE FERRY-Follow Palisade Blvd. south (Route No. 1) until you come to Route No. 5 (125th St. Ferry approach), turn right, and continue as from 125 th St. Ferry.

## BY BUS

Bus marked "Rutherford" from terminal at 51st St. and Broadway (Capitol Terminal), 37th St. and Sixth Ave., 23rd St. and Eighth Ave. (Cornish Arms), Hotel Astor Terminal, 36th St. and Sixth Ave. These buses do not pass the nursery. Get off in East Rutherford, corner Hackensack St. and Paterson Plank Road, take bus or trolley going toward Passaic or Paterson, riding about a mile to directly in front of the nursery. Otherwise, continue on the New York bus to Rutherford Station and take a taxi from there.

## BY TRAIN

Take the Hudson and Manhattan Tube to Erie Station in Jersey City; the first stop on the Main Line is Rutherford; taxi from Rutherford.
