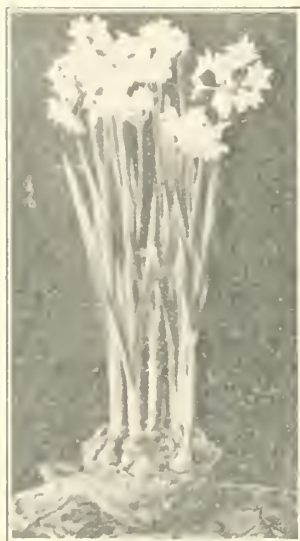

Place six or eight bulbs in a shallow bowl with water; support the bulbs with pebbles, and place the bowl in the dark until the roots have started, when they should be brought into the light. Change the water occasionally to keep it pure. From our experiments November, December and January plants give best results.

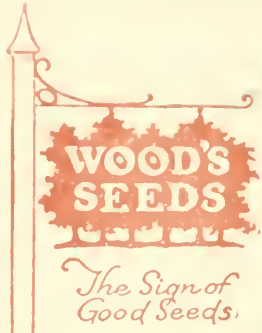

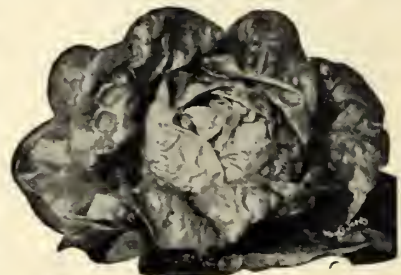
