

WATSON S. WOODRUFF

It is with deep regret that we announce the death on September 4th, 1930, of our Mr. Watson S. Woodruff at his home in Orange, Connecticut. He was born in Orange on April 8th, 1869, being the son of Stiles Denison and Elizabeth Clark Woodruff, a descendant from old Connecticut stock.

He was a partner in the firm of S. D. Woodruff & Sons, seedsmen, being associated with his brother, Frank C. Woodruff, for forty years. He was President of West Haven Bank & Trust Company, which office he held since the organization of the bank in 1912; a director of The American Bank & Trust Company and The Commercial Bank & Trust Company of Bridgeport, Connecticut; President of The Cromwell Water Company and The Orange Water Company.

Mr. Woodruff served as President of The American Seed Trade Association during 1908. He was a prominent Republican, having served as a member of the House of Representatives from Orange, and Senator from the 14th Senatorial District. He was a member of the World War Draft Board No. 7,

succeeding Hon. George M. Gunn of Milford as Chairman.

He was a member and past-director of Kiwanis Club of New Haven, also of the Congregational Club, and Deacon and Clerk of the Congregational Church of Orange. Member of State Y. M. C. A. Board, Sons of the American Revolution and Gamma Delta Psi Fraternity.

He is survived by his widow, Harriett Hotchkiss, and three daughters, Mrs. M. Grant Blakeslee of New Haven, Connecticut; Mrs. Sanford M. Treat of Jackson Heights, N. Y.; and Mrs. Robert T. Elliott of Germantown, Pa., and six grandchildren, as well as a sister, Miss Mary R. Woodruff, and two brothers, Frank C. and Robert J. Woodruff.

Atlee Burpee for \$5.00 per bushel, a whale of a price for corn in those days, and introduced to the trade as Country Gentleman. It is one of the oldest large selling varieties and no one has ever been able to find a corn to take its place, either for Canners or Gardeners. For forty years S. D.
