# Wholesale Prices and Terms For Market Growers and Florists

Effective January 1, 1932, all invoices for purchases will be charged at the prices quoted in this Burpee Blue List, unless **special offers** are made by letter or telegram and referred to when the order is placed.

We expect to adhere throughout the spring to the prices quoted herein, unless some causes beyond our control require a change, in which case we shall be governed by the market. All goods are offered subject to prior sale, and we reserve the right to change prices without notice, if it should become necessary.

## Credit and Terms of Payment

Our terms are cash with order unless you have an account with us or are satisfactorily rated by the commercial agencies. To regular customers and those of approved credit, our terms are **60 days net**; 2% discount for cash in ten days from date of invoice or 3% discount when cash accompanies the order, for Vegetable and Flower Seeds and Flower Bulbs. **No discount** on Grass, Clover and Field Seeds, Onion Sets, Potatoes, Vegetable Roots, Flowering Bulbs, Roots, Nursery Stock, and Supplies, which are **net cash**.

New customers, unless satisfactorily rated with the commercial agencies, should furnish us with at least three trade references. Orders from new customers amounting to less than \$5.00 should be accompanied by cash.

Orders for seeds will be shipped C. O. D. upon receipt of a deposit of 25% of the value of the order. Due to their perishable nature, Bulbs, Roots, and Nursery Stock **cannot** be shipped C. O. D.

You run no risk in sending remittance with your order. Our reputation as honest and experienced seedsmen is known the world over. You can inquire of any bank or trust company or of your neighbors as to our responsibility.

Remit by money order, draft, or check. Register your letter if you send cash or stamps.

For the exclusive use of Market Growers and Florists, who on account of the larger quantities of seeds they require are entitled to these Special Wholesale Prices. We are anxious to do all we can to help you make a success of your business by supplying the finest seeds it is possible to furnish and let you have them at low prices. As a grower, you know the importance of Good Seeds; you cannot take chances on the quality of the seed from which you expect to make your profits. Sow Burpee's Tested Seeds—you can rely on them. 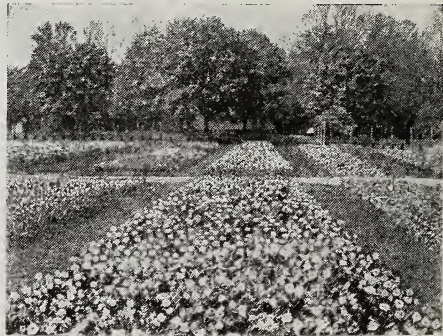

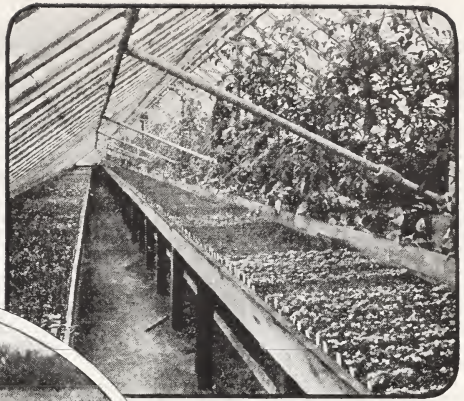
