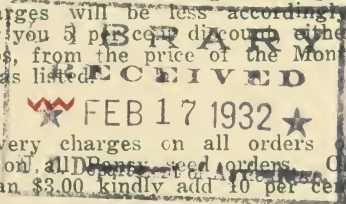

I will prepay delivery charges on all orders of \$3.00 and over, also on all ~~Department of Agriculture~~ seed orders. On any orders of less than \$3.00 kindly add 10 per cent for delivery.



Owing to our winter being very open this year, it will necessitate our digging lily bulbs within the next few weeks. The sooner you can plant these bulbs, the better it will be, but if you do not wish your order shipped until the middle of March or the 1st of April, and you have not the storage facilities, kindly notify me and I will endeavor to hold back the growth by placing the bulbs in a cold-storage warehouse, if you will add 50 cents to assist in the expenses of same.



We urge that you mail your order at once. It will give us a better idea of just what variety and size of lily bulb you wish, and we can lift them before growth begins.

MARTAGON ALBUM—white Turks-cap Lily. Very dependable, particularly in the New England States. Plant in groups of 3 or 6 among your Blue Canterbury Bells. Blooms June-July. Height 3-5 Ft. I offer 4-6 inches Cir.

SULPHUREUM—sulphur-yellow with deeper yellow throat tinged claret without. A wonderful large lily bringing almost the joy of Regal in August and September, after the Regal is gone. Plant in groups with the Montbretias as a color scheme. Height 4-6 Ft. Large blooming size.

HYBRID MONTBRETIAS

Earlham Large-Flowered

These are the new Montbretias which gained the Gold Medal at the Royal Horticultural Society Shows, and are the result of hybridization carried out by Mr. Sidney Morris of Earlham Hall, Norwich. They are an enormous advance on the ordinary Montbretias in commerce, being generally much taller and more robust in growth, and having flowers of great size and beauty, some of them measuring 3 to 4 inches in diameter. They are of splendid value for cutting.

GOLD FINCH—bright yellow with small maroon blotches at center, outer petals heavily shaded brilliant cherry-scarlet, very decorative.
