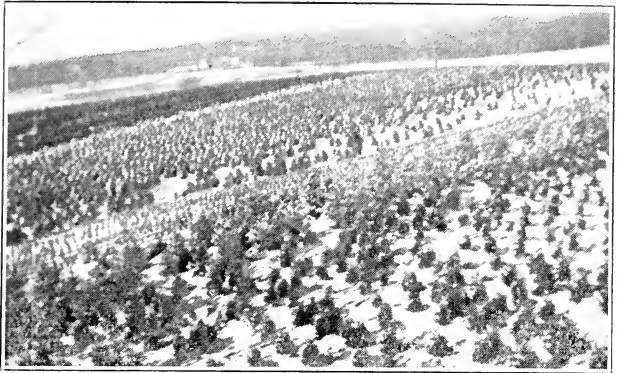

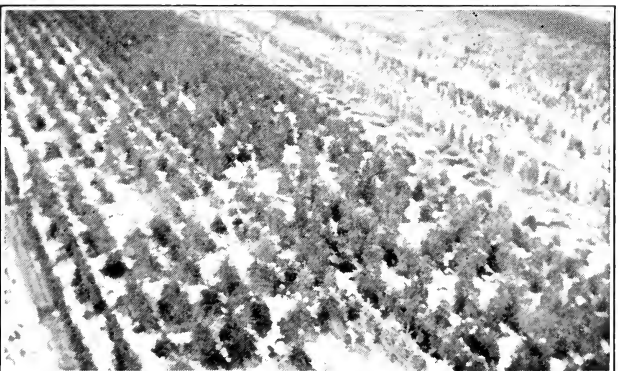

BUSINESS TERMS

TERMS—Cash or satisfactory trade references must accompany all orders from purchasers unknown to us, 2% discount on bills paid in full within 10 days. 6% interest added to Spring accounts after June 1st, and Fall accounts after December 1st.

TRANSPORTATION—We advise transportation only by auto-truck or railroad carload. The advantage of this is that stock arrives in better condition. The cost of boxing and bailing is high and during the shipping season orders not boxed or baled can be more quickly executed. We will deliver anywhere within a hundred miles of our nursery, for which we make a moderate charge.

COMPLAINTS—Our stock is transplanted and trimmed properly and will do well under ordinary conditions. However we naturally cannot guarantee it to grow under all conditions.

PRICES—250, 25, or 5 of one variety will be furnished at the 1000, 100, or 10 rate respectively.

AN INVITATION—We have one hundred acres under cultivation and shall be glad to show any of our friends in the trade around our nursery.

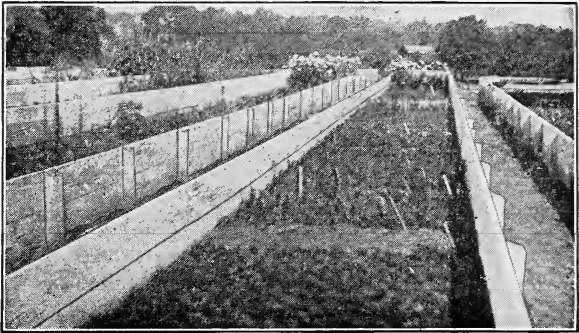
