

#### TO OUR PATRONS AND FRIENDS:-

For over thirty years I have been sending you a letter, every January in my catalog, and so many of you have answered my letter, in the form of an order or inquiry, that in many cases we have become fast friends.

This may possibly be my last letter, as thirty years of the strenuous work necessary to carry on a

nursery business, is, I feel, all one man should give of a life.

We want to sell all the stock that is left on the place, this year, if we can. Our stock was never better. We still have a good lot of all standard varieties, and an immense stock in Ash Seedlings, Apple Trees. Shade Trees and Black Hills Spruce.

We shall give your order the same careful attention that we have always practiced. We want your order early, as the sooner you get it in, the better selection yo uwill have. We should like the privilege of substituting different sizes, or varieties as good. If you are willing that we do this, mark the order

blank accordingly.

For early orders ON or BEFORE MARCH 1st, 1916, we will give a 5 per cent discount to be taken in stock. Thus: if you send a \$25.00 order, you may select \$1.25 worth of stock and add it to your order. Or, we will send you one nice Apple Tree (our selection) for every \$5.00 worth of nursery stock you buy before March 15, 1916. We can only allow you one offer with each order.
