Early Egyptian—

Small tops, roots dark red, rounded on top, flat on bottom, about two inches in diameter when mature. An extra early market variety.

Small tops, flattened-globe shaped, roots very smooth, bright red. An early table beet.

Country Gentleman—

The earliest white sweet corn. Ears medium sized, grains long slender "Shoe Peg" type.

CABBAGE

Early Jersey Wakefield—

The earliest and surest. Heads medium size, very solid, uniformly pointed.

Heads are round, solid and of excellent quality. Leaves are thick, smooth and of medium light green color.

Heads are exceptionally large, very solid. Leaves medium light green, nearly round.

Heads nearly round, somewhat flattened, close, firm and very solid.

Often called celery cabbage. Leaves light green in color, crimped, forms head like Cos Lettuce.

New York Improved Purple—

Usually produces four to six oval fruits, dark purple color.

Early Scarlet Horn—

Tops small, roots orange-red, about three inches long.

Vines hardy, bearing fruits in clusters of two or three.

- Irish Gray—
Flesh is crisp and delicious, ripening close to a tough gray rind. The melons are of unusual size and are popular for market gardening.
