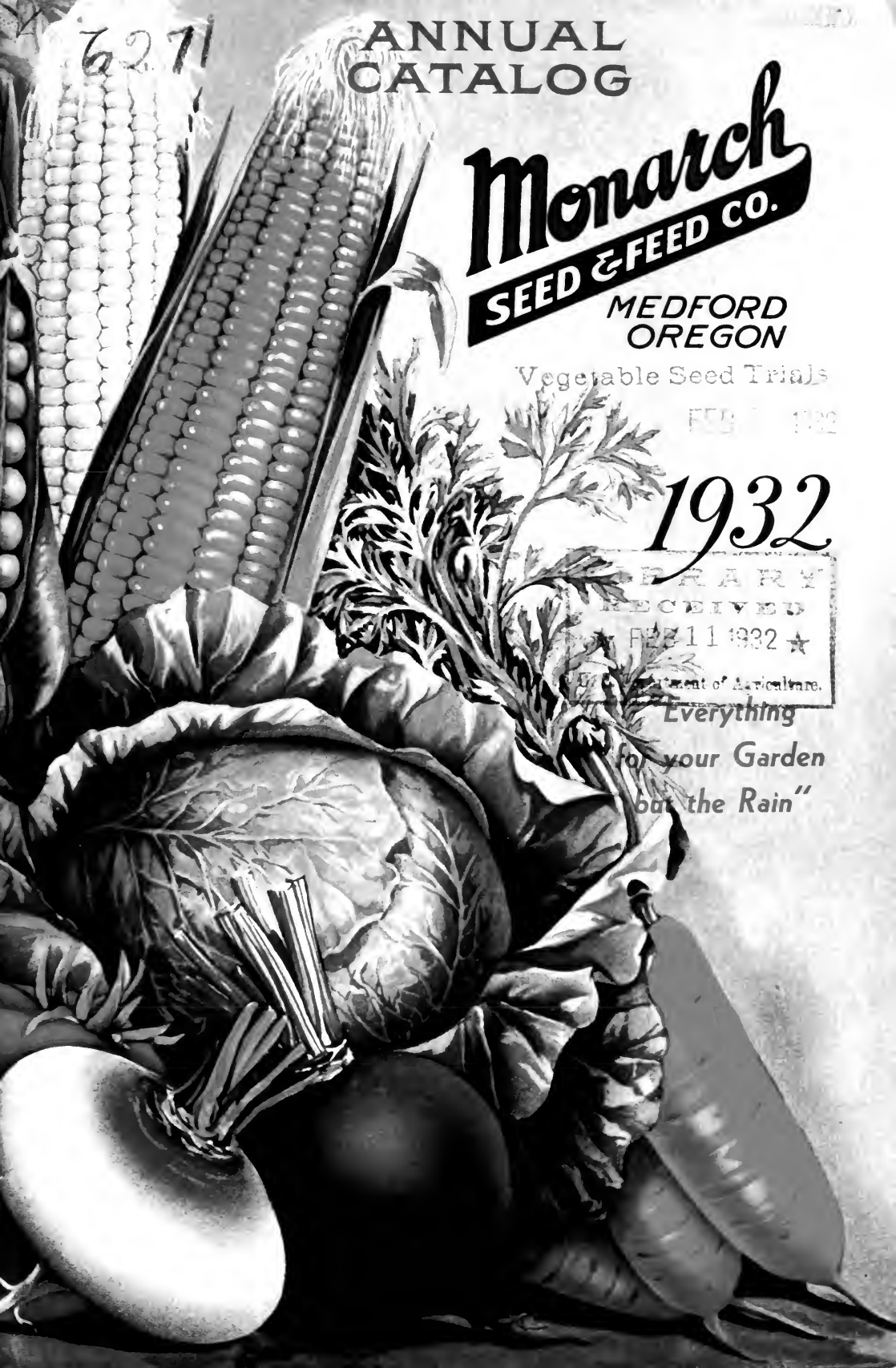

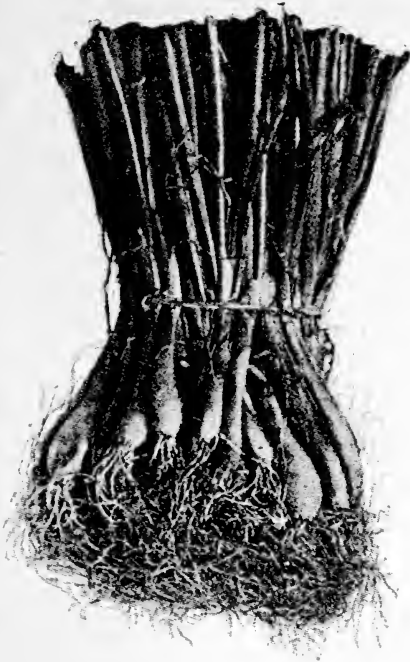

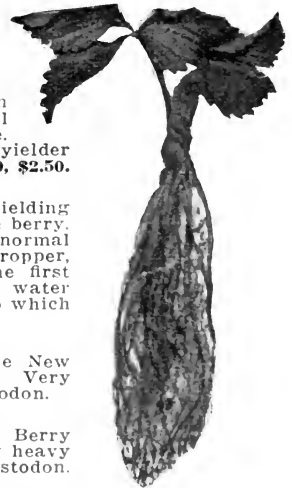

Vegetable Seeds

Dwarf or Bush Beans

One pound will plant a row 100 feet long; about 1¼ bushels to the acre.

HOW TO GROW DWARF or BUSH BEANS—Make the rows 18 inches or 2 feet apart, and drop the beans 4 inches apart in the row. If the soil is warm and loose, plant 2 inches deep; if rather cold and wet, plant only one inch deep. Beans, especially the yellow-podded varieties, will rot very easily if planted when the soil is wet and the atmosphere is cold. If you do not want to run the risk of replanting them, do not plant your beans until the soil is warm. Cultivate often but never when the plants are wet, as this brings on rust. Pick the beans as fast as they become fit for use; this makes them bear longer.

MONARCH IMPROVED STRINGLESS GREEN-POD—A very desirable dwarf green-podded sort for home garden and largely grown for the market. Plants are large, spreading and productive. Pods are medium green, 5 to 6 inches long, cylindrical, of high quality and remain crisp and tender a long time. Seeds are of a medium size and length and brown. Second to none as a home garden bean. Pkt. 20c; ½ lb. 30c; 1 lb. 50c.

EXTRA EARLY REFUGEE—Medium sized round light green pods of good quality. Early and of good flavor. Plants are a little smaller, more upright and the leaves larger than those of the late Refugee. Pole or Running Varieties

CULTURE—One pound will plant 50 hills, 30 pounds per acre. The soil should be mellow, rich and warm. Lay the ground out in hills 4 feet apart each way, and set poles 8 to 10 feet long firmly in the hills before planting the seed. Plant 5 or 6 beans in a hill and cover about 2 inches deep; leave three plants at each pole, and when a few inches high draw a little earth around them as support. Set the poles before the plants have grown to large size; many gardeners consider it an advantage to set the poles when planting, thus avoiding disturbing the small plant or its roots.

London Horticultural or Speckled Cranberry Bean

LONDON HORTICULTURAL or SPECKLED CRANBERRY—One of the best of the Horticultural varieties as a general purpose late green shell bean for home or market. The vines are moderately vigorous with large, light colored leaves. The pods are medium length, four and one-half to five and one-half inches, pale green when young, becoming as they mature yellowish green striped or splashed with red. The beans are large, ovate, flesh colored, splashed and spotted with wine-red and of the highest quality, either green or dry. Many like this sort better than limas. Pkt. 15c; ½ lb. 30c; lb. 50c.

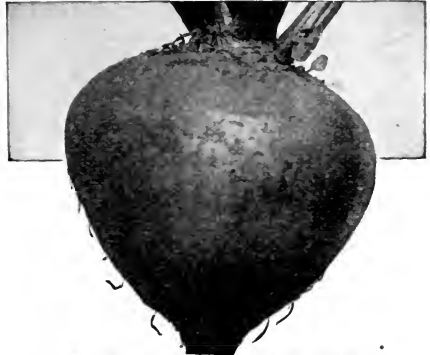

Beets

CULTURE—Well enriched, light soil is best adapted for the culture of beets. Sow in drills 1 foot apart and cover half inch. It is important that the earth be pressed firmly about the seed. When the plants are large enough, thin to 4 inches apart. Use thinnings for greens if desired. For early crop, sow as soon as the ground can be worked, and continue for succession until the first of July. Liberal manuring should be done for Mangels and Sugar Beets. They should stand 10 to 12 inches apart in the rows.

Monarch Detroit Dark Red This is one of the best for market and home garden, and on account of its uniformly deep rich color the most desirable for canning. Cabbage

CULTURE—The earliest cabbages may be enjoyed in May from seeds sown in the house or hot-bed. Early Jersey Wakefield matures in 90 days, and later varieties in 100 to 115 days. Both early and mid-season varieties should be started in house or hot-bed, and for late or Fall varieties sow the seed in the seed bed in May and early June. Plenty of room should be given plants, at least two feet each way. They need a light and well watered soil, rich in nitrogen. Frequent applications of nitrate of soda or sulphate of ammonia or some other nitrogenous fertilizer will work wonders. Cabbage worms may be kept off by dusting with our Sulfo-Lead dust or spraying with arsenate of lead.

Monarch Copenhagen Market

SPECIAL STRAIN—Heads average around ten pounds each in weight, are hard and solid with small core. Quality is extra fine and sweet; matures early as Wakefield and yields more per acre in weight. It is a short stemmed variety, the heads nearly resting on the ground. MAKING A LAWN. First obtain pure seed. Loosen the soil in which a new lawn is to be made to a depth of at least five inches, and lighten it with humus or several inches of compost, or use well rotted manure you know to be "positively free of weed seeds." Apply fertilizer liberally either sheep manure, bonemeal or a good commercial fertilizer. Sow in the early spring when cool weather and ample rainfall will insure complete germination and a good start for the seedlings before hot dry weather comes. By all means prevent the ground from drying out, even for a few minutes while seed is germinating. Early fall is a fine time to plant. Rake the seed in well and roll so that the soil is firm over the seed. Where seed is sown on an old lawn always cover it with a top dressing of sand or soil and fertilizer. Seed thrown on the top of hard ground has no chance to grow and will merely wash off.
