## Sedum (Stonecrop)

The backbone of the rock garden. Charming plants for sunny locations. Various colors. Thrive in almost any soil.

### Spectabila

Brilliant. Erect growing sort, sometimes 15 inches high. Broad, light green foliage. Handsome heads of rose-colored flowers. Fine fall blooming plant.....25c

### Obtusatum

Emerald green foliage, shaded bronze. 3 inches .....30c

### Samentosum

Dwarf variety. Fine for filling seams between rocks in garden wall.....25c

### Sedum Stolonifera

Very desirable sedum. Flowers purplish pink. 6 inches .....25c

### Veronica Incona, White

Wooly plant. Blueflowers. Good rockery plant .....25c

### Veronica Speedwell Traversi

A hardy variety. Blooms in late summer. Purple .....25c

### Ajuga—Buglewaad, variegated

For rockery or carpeting. Blue flowers. 6-8 inches .....25c

### Alpine Aster

Showy purple-blue flowers in May and June. 8-10 inches. Fine for rockery.....25c

### Wallflower

Fine rock plant. Orange flowers 12 inches high. Biennial, as it sometimes blooms itself to death .....25c

### Nepeta Mussini—Catmint

Excellent for any place where a mass of flower and foliage is wanted. Lavender. 12 in. ....25c

### Oenothera Missouriensis or Evening Primrose

June to August. Yellow. Low grower, profuse bloomer. For rock garden or border. ....25c

### Dwarf Iris—Pumila Artoviolecea

For rock gardens. Purple. 6-8 inch.....25c

### Low Campanula—Belleflower

Pale blue Carpathian Harebell. Free to bloom .....25c



**Halianthemum—Rock or Sun Rose**

Low growing plant, 12 inches. A mass of bloom in June and July. Grand for rockery or dry, sunny bank.....25c

**Asperula—Woodruff**

6-8 inches. Increases rapidly. Fine for carpeting shady places and in rock gardens. White flowers .....30c

**Arbrietia—Rock Cress**

One of the most beautiful of all creeping rock plants .....25c

**Armeria, Sea Pink**

Fine edging plant, rosy pink flowers, hardy rock plant, 9-12 inches.....25c

**Armeria, Formosa**

Taller flower stems, 12 in., light pink...20c

**Arabis**

True Rock Cress, best known of rock plants. White flowers. Single.....20c

**Arabis, Alpina**

Flore pleno. Double flowers.....25c

**Saponaria Ocymoides****Ocymoides Alba**

A grand white flowering plant for wall or rockery .....25c

**Ocymoides Splendus**

Pink flowers .....25c

**Viola Hybrids**

Everblooming if not allowed to go to seed.

**Jersey Gem**

Rich violet .....25c

Golden yellow, light blue, white.....20c

**Dicentra Eximia—Plumy Bleeding Heart**

Dwarf habit. Will grow under almost any conditions .....25c

**Achillea Tomentosa**

6-8 inches. Bright yellow flowers. Good for rockery. Millefolium, rose color.....25c

**Linum Flax**

Desirable for rockery. 2 feet high. Very light feathery foliage, profusion of pale blue flowers .....25c

**Dianthus (Pinks)****Deltordes**

Maiden pink. Beautiful little plant. Grows well in rockery. Narrow foliage, 3-6 in...20c

**Plumarius**

Clove pink. Flowers on long spikes, guaucus foliage. Fine for border.....20c

**Sempervinevum (House Leek)**

Curious and interesting plants, forming rosettes of succulent leaves of varying colors. Good for rockeries, dry banks, carpet bedding or walls.

**Lydium**

Very fine rock plant. Bronze green.....25c

**Small Cobweb House Leek**

Tips of leaves in rosettes, usually connected by silvery threads. Hence its name.....35c

**Tectorum**

Broad rosettes. Leaves have reddish brown tips, flowers pale red. Plant large, 8-10 inches across .....15c and 25c

**Funcki**

Green tipped brownish rosettes. Produces rapidly .....25c

Golden Ball. Dwarf. Good border plant. June to October. 18-24 inch.....25c

**Mertensia (Blue Bells) Virginica**

Early spring flowering plant, 12-18 inches. Most interesting of our native plants. Blue flowers fading to clear pink.....20c

**Veronica (Rupestris Alba)**

Splendid prostrate rock plant. Thick green matt, white flowers in May.....25c

**Thymus (Wooly Thyme)**

Dense matt of dark green foliage, pink flowers, low growing.....25c

**Saxafraga (Cordifolia) 1 ft.**

Handsome broad leaves, flowers very early. Fine among rocks.....35c

**Trollius (Europeaus superbus)**

Pale yellow flowers 1-2 ft. May to Aug...35c

**Chives**

1 ft. Purple flower.....25c

**Geum**

1-2 ft. Attractive yellow flowers, blooms nearly all summer.....25c

**Arabis (Rock Cress)**

Rosa, small pink flowers.....25c

**Heuchera (Coral Bells)**

Dainty pink flowers, 1-2 ft. high. Fine for cutting and for rock garden.....25c

**Delphinium—Hardy Larkspur**

Grandest blue flower grown. Grows 3-5 ft., with all shades of blue from light sky-blue to purple-black. Single and double, white and black bee in center.

Strong 2 Year Plants.....25c

**Foxglove**

White to purple, all shades, 3-5 feet.

Plant in fall for next summer's flowers.

**Tall Growing Bocconia—Plume Poppy**

4-6 feet. Plant in shrub borders or among tall perennials .....20c

**Golden Sprays (Lysimachia Ciliata)**

Long sprays of bright yellow flowers in July. Grows three feet. Very fine. Plants.....25c

**Pyrethrum (Painted Daisy)**

Hardy, easy to grow, free flowering, fine for cutting, one of the very best hardy plants. Various shades, light pink to red. Large clumps .....25c

Double flowers white or pink.....50c

**Lupins**

Tall growing plants, 2-3 ft. Pink, white or blue, handsome foliage, fine for cutting...25c

**Shasta Daisy**

Hardy, good for cutting.....20c

**Artemisia**

Tall, 3-4 ft. White flowers, open bushy heads, fine foliage, splendid flower for cutting. August and September.....25c

**Artemisia (Silver King)**

3 ft. Striking white leaved plant, entire plant silver frosted effect. Cut for winter bouquets .....25c

**Sidalcae (Greek Mallow)**

Erect growing, 2-3 ft., rose colored flowers. June, July. Nice for cutting, easy to grow. ....25c

**Cemicifuga (Snake Root)**

4-6 ft. White flower spike, likes shade. July and August .....25c

**Gaillardia—Blanket Flower**

One of the most desirable plants in cultivation. Many shades, orange yellow to almost red. 3-4 inches across flower. Very free to bloom on any soil or any weather.....20c

**Coreopsis**

Hardy plant. Bright yellow flowers all summer. Long stems, fine for cutting.....20c



**Statice (Latifolia)**

A valuable plant. Leathery leaves. Small flowers, much used in bouquets.....35c

**Oriental Poppy**

3 year roots. 300 of them while they last. A real bargain .....25c
