Hardy Waterlilies

GLADSTONE—Large pure dazzling white blossoms with yellow heart. \$1.50

GONNERE—Very fine double; globelike in form blooming over a long period. This is an especially attractive lily and well worth the price. \$4.00

CHROMATELLA—Bright yellow with broad petals and a favorite variety. Leaves blotched with maroon. \$1.50.

SUNRISE—This is a gem; having large, beautifully formed flowers, rising gracefully out of the water. Long blooming season. \$4.00

MARLIAC CARNEA (PINK)—Flesh pink fragrant flowers, and a profuse bloomer. \$1.00.

ROSE AREY—Deep cerise pink, having pointed petals, giving a distinctive shape to the flower \$2.00

PAUL HARIOT—A charming flower, opening yellow, suffused with rose, deepening to copper red as it grows older. Profuse bloomer, and good for large or small pools. \$2.00

COMANCHE—This is the most beautiful of the sunset colors, very brilliant and glowing. The plant is strong in growth and has a long blooming season. \$2.50

ROBINSONI—Warm red with orange stamens. A very beautiful lily, and a good bloomer. \$2.50

CONQUEROR—Carmine red, very free flowering, and a vigorous grower. \$2.50

ESCARBOUCLE—One of the deepest red lilies grown. It fairly glows with color and makes a wonderful display. \$4.00

Tropical Lilies

Tropical waterlilies are so beautiful that every pool should have at least one. They are worth the purchase price many times over in the joy they give. The blooms rise out of the water on tall stems, and are most lovely and very fragrant and colorful.

The bulbs can be lifted and stored in damp sand and planted in the pool when warm settled weather comes in spring. They bloom until frost.

PANAMA-PACIFIC—A splendid variety having large reddish purple flowers with yellow centers. New plants are formed on the leaves, and often bloom, being miniature replicas of the larger flowers. \$2.00

MRS. GEORGE H. PRING.—This is a grand lily, being pure white with yellow center. Very fragrant and a good cut flower. \$2.00

MRS. C. W. WARD—Deep rose pink and a most beautiful lily, always attracting attention. Very large flowers, on extra long stems. Good cut flower. \$2.00

PENNSYLVANIA—One of the best blues, bearing very large blooms. Yellow center with blue tipped stamens. Very desirable. \$2.50

Night Blooming Tropicals

Night blooming lilies open in the evening, remaining open all night and most of the morning. They are very interesting and the flowers are lovely.

GEORGE HUSTER—Brilliant red flowers, with the stamens arranged in a cone. Lovely red leaves. \$2.00

JUNO—Pure white flowers which open widely, having a cone of yellow stamens. \$2.00

Lotus

EGYPTIAN LOTUS—The immense pink flowers and leaves rise out of the water in stately beauty. The plants should be confined in a box or separate pool, as they are very rampant growers. Handle tubers very carefully, so as not to break off sprout in planting. Dormant tubers till April. \$2.00

Oxygenating and Floating Plants

Every pool needs plenty of these, as they help keep the water clear.

FISH GRASS—Leaves in whorls, being submerged 10c per bunch.

PARROT FEATHER—Bright filmy leaves in whorls, floating. 10c per bunch.

WATER POPPY—Floating plant with yellow poppy-like flowers. 10c

LANCE LEAF—Lance shaped leaves, white flowers in spikes. Keep confined. 15c

ARROWHEAD—Arrow shaped leaves, flowers in a spike, white with maroon blotch. Makes a large clump. 25c

PICKEREL PLANT—Marsh plant with heart shaped leaves and dark blue flower spikes. Shallow water. Splendid plant. 25c

WATER HYACINTH—Floating plant with trusses of dainty lavender flowers. Blooms best in a shaded location with roots in soil. 10c

Water Hawthorne-Aponogeton

WATER HAWTHORNE (APONOGETON)

This plant deserves special mention. In mild climates it grows and blooms all winter, going dormant in the summer. The oblong floating leaves grow in a circle, as also do the interesting forked flower spikes, which are sweetly scented. 50c

Marginal Plants

PAPYRUS—This makes a tall clump, the stems being surmounted by a tuft of thread-like leaves. Very picturesque. Pool side or shallow water. 50c

UMBRELLA PALM—This is a fine tropical appearing plant for the pool side or planted in the water. 25c

PALM GRASS—Forms clumps of palm-like pleated leaves arching gracefully. 25c

RIBBON GRASS—Clumps about a foot high with leaves streaked green and white. 15c

HARDY FOUNTAIN GRASS—A splendid grass with narrow stiff blades, surmounted by many feathery plumes. 25c

Snails

SNAILS—Every pool needs snails, as they help keep the water pure, feeding on decaying vegetation.. 10c each, \$1.00 per dozen.

For a Successful Water Garden

1. A water tight pool, preferably cement, 18 to 24 inches deep, in full sun if possible. Lotus do well in shade.

2. Very rich soil. Place well decayed cow manure in the boxes 3 or 4 inches deep, cover with good garden soil and 1 inch of sand.

3. Give the plants plenty of room. Make boxes 18 to 24 inches square, 10 to 12 inches deep for 1 or 2 lilies.

4. Gold fish or Mosquito fish to keep mosquitos down; snails and oxygenating plants.

5. Do not keep changing the water. Run in enough to keep proper level as water evaporates.
