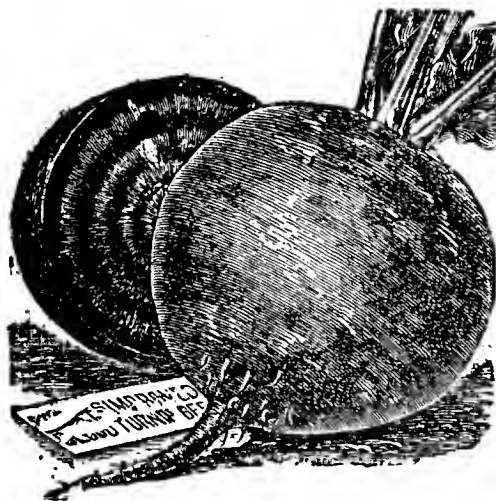

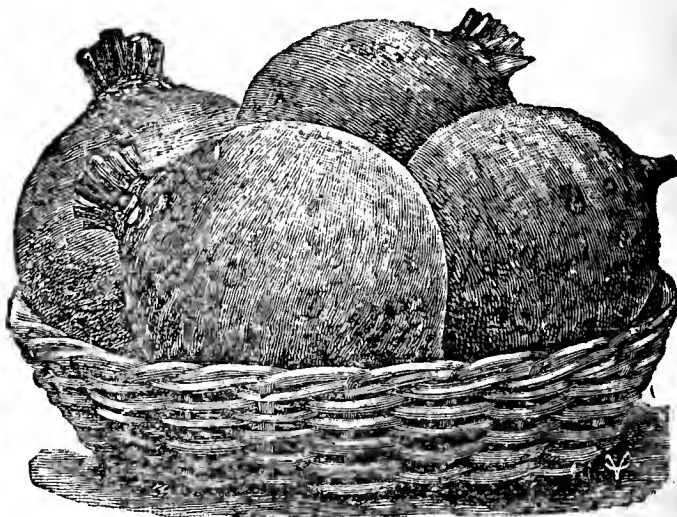

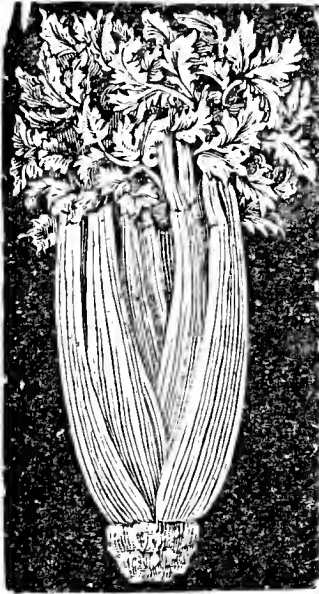

CHINESE OR CELERY CABBAGE. This vegetable is called Pe-Tsai or cut cabbage by the Chinese gardeners and is beginning to attract attention in America. It does not form a cabbage head, but when grown to its full size resembles the Cos Lettuce, and the outer leaves may be used during its growth. The flavor is mild and it is used either as a salad or cooked. The plants require plenty of room and should be set in rows two to three feet apart and fifteen inches apart in the row. Seed should be sown after July 1st as early plantings run to seed. Pkt. 5c; oz. 25c; ¼ lb. 75c.

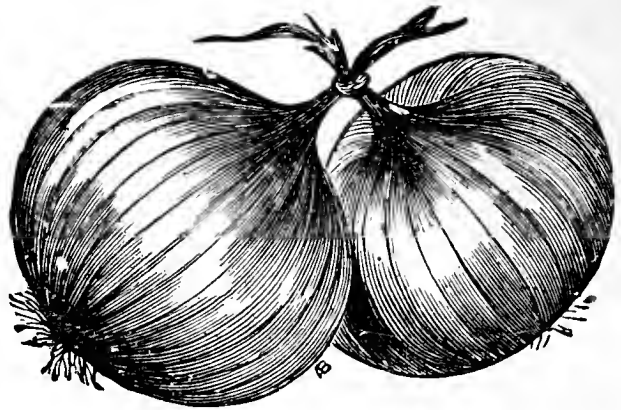

ONION

MAMMOTH PRIZE TAKER. Like nearly all Spanish onions, this makes extra large size onions and of particular fine flavor. The outside skin is a rich yellow straw color, and the flesh is pure white; sweet, mild and tender. Ripens up fine and hard, and makes a very handsome and attractive onion. Pkt. 5c; oz. 20c; $\frac{1}{4}$ lb. 60c.

LARGE RED WETHERSFIELD. With proper soil and culture this will quickly grow to marketable size from seed. The skin is deep purplish red; flesh white, sometimes slightly tinged pink; mild and sweet.
