HARDY PLANTS

For Rockery or Borders

These are all in good condition to move at once and will make nice well rooted plants before Winter. None of them need Winter protection.

DORONICUM CAUCASICUM. Tall yellow early daisy like flowers. Blooms for Mother's Day.

VERONICA INCANA. Plants blooming in June are thickly set with miniature spires of beautiful blue flowers 8 to 10 inches tall. Silvery foliage.

DICENTRA EXIMIA. This is the plummy bleeding heart with racemes of pink flowers throughout the Summer. Foliage is feathery.

PHLOX SUBULATA. Forms a blanket of flowers in May not over 4 inches high. Fast growing creeper. Plant in full sunshine. Three colors: Rose, Lilac and White.

MADONNA LILIES (CANDIDIUM). We have a nice stock of firm solid bulbs that will give excellent blooms in June, if planted in August or September.

SEMPERVIVUMS

Hen and Chickens or House Leek

Probably the most interesting of all the Rockery plants. While the old plant will flower the main interest is in the peculiar foliage growth.

ARACHNOIDEUM. This is the **COBWEB** form. Each rosette appears as if covered with cobwebs.

ARENARIUM. We call this the **BANTAM**. Rosettes are extremely small and will grow with fairly a pinch of soil in rock crevices.

FIMBRIATUM. Green rosettes fringed with hairy edges.

GLOBIFERUM. Globe shape crowns made up of short leaf scales.

RUBICUNDUM. Large rosettes, red in Winter and greenish red in Summer.

TECTORUM. Very large rosettes, bright green. Red flowers on stems a foot high.

Single crowns of the above 15c each, 4 for 50c, 9 for \$1.00. Heavy clumps for immediate effect 40c each.

HELPFUL HINTS

AUGUST 1933

Some things you can do best in August

IRIS. If you want to move any of your Iris, the sooner you do it the better. Order your new ones and get them planted to become well rooted before Winter.

DELPHINIUM. After flowers are faded cut the stalks off within 2 inches of the ground. If they have not done well, apply lime to sweeten the soil.

ORIENTAL POPPIES. These should be planted before the first of September, while the plants are dormant.

CANDIDIUM (Madonna) LILY. Should be planted in August or early September, to allow time for making a full growth of foliage.

DORONICUM (Leopards Bane). Beautiful yellow daisy like flower 2 1-2 to 3 feet high blooming for Mother's Day. Plants are dormant now and a good time to move them or buy plants.

VERONICA INCANA. Excellent for Rock Gardens or hardy borders. Perfectly hardy anywhere. Dwarf.

SEDUMS AND SEMPERVIVUMS. Fill in the blank spaces or add to your rockery plantings now. We list in this folder a number of rock garden and border plants which are in condition to move now.

Time to think about placing your orders for Tulips, Hyacinths and Narcissus, which you will want to plant in October.

We hope to issue these folders at least every two months. A post card request will bring it to you regularly. We aim to make it helpful in planning and planting your garden.

SEDUMS

(Stonecrop)

Sedums are the best known and the most used of all Rock Garden plants. They do best in full sunshine with good drainage. All of those listed below are dwarf creeping varieties.

ALBUM. Waxy round green foliage and white flowers.

GLAUCUM. Fine bluish green foliage. White flowers.

KAMCHATICUM. Orange yellow flowers. Green foliage turning to golden in the Fall.

KAMCHATICUM VARIEGATED. Orange yellow flowers. Foliage variegated green and golden.

LYDIUM. Foliage green except in dry midsummer when it is bright red.

OBTUSATUM. Peculiar fleshy bronze green foliage.

MURALE. Dark fleshy foliage. Covered with a mass of dainty cream pink flowers in July.

PRUNIATUM. Foliage forms a mass of trailing green globular heads. Flowers yellow, 4 inches tall.

Mother's Old Fashioned BLEEDING HEART

Extra strong roots that will bloom next Spring if planted now. 40c each, 3 for \$1.00 postpaid.

JAPANESE IRIS

Plant while dormant in location where you can give them plenty of water. Soil condition should be slightly acid if possible.

COMPLETE RANGE of all colors single and double mixed not named. 6 for \$1.00, 25 for \$3.00.

EXTRA FINE DOUBLE varieties, each labeled by name, 10 distinct kinds, 30c each, 4 for \$1.00, all 10 for \$2.25 postpaid.

SEEDS

Plant seeds now and young plants will go through the Winter in well drained beds and be ready to transplant early in the Spring.

DELPHINIUM GOLD MEDAL HYBRIDS. All shades of blue, mauve, and purple. Both single and double. Pkt. 400 seeds 25c.

DELPHINIUM BLACKMORE and LANGDON. Seeds saved from all double, extra select plants. Pkt. 200 seeds 50c.

DELPHINIUM WHITE. Seeds from select white plants. Pkt. 200 seeds 50c.

CANTERBURY BELLS. CUP AND SAUCE. Fine blend of all colors. Pkt. 400 seeds 25c.

FOX GLOVES. Giant strain Shirley, in all colors mixed. Pkt. 400 seeds 25c.

DELPHINIUM

An acre of three year old plants must be moved. Now is the best time to do it. They have just finished the first flowering and if given plenty of water most of them will flower again this summer. **PLANT NOW** and they will be well rooted to carry through the winter.

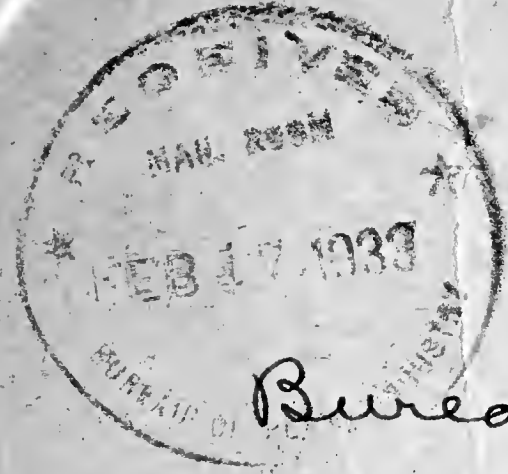
Hybrid Delphinium, vary in color, they are light blue, dark blue, orchid, violet, purple and mauve. We can not send exact colors, but can send either light or dark shades as you wish. (Not guaranteed as to color.) Some of these are double flowers and center (or bee) may be white, black, brown or variegated.

Do not confuse these with small seedlings. They are so large that we recommend shipping with ball of earth attached. **Belladonna Delphinium**, are light blue and have white centers and are best for small house decoration with other flowers.

Hybrids each 25c, 3 for 50c, 8 for \$1.00. Hybrids with earth ball, each 30c, 2 for 50c, 5 for \$1.00
Belladonna each 25c, 4 for 50c, 10 for \$1.00. Belladonna with ball of earth, each 30c, 3 for 50c, 7 for \$1.00

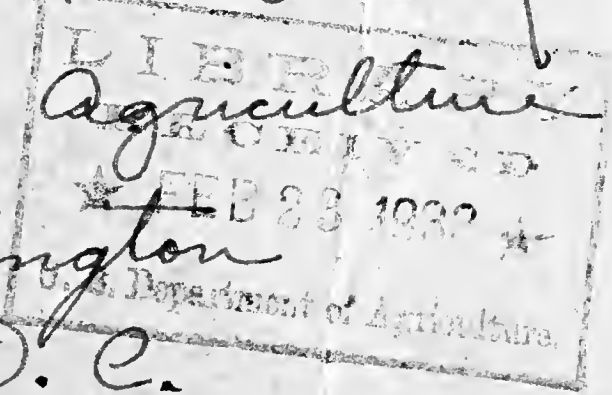
