


# How to Grow Irises

Have good average garden soil to which is added a little bone meal. Plant rhizome one inch deep and firm down top soil. Do not allow water to stand on Irises summer or winter. Use crushed limestone early in March and September as Irises like lime. Be sure to cultivate and cultivate.

Irises do better planted in plenty of sunshine, and divide every four years. Plant them in masses as the colors show up better.

July is the best time to replant Irises.

I ship them any day from March to December, except the newer varieties which go forward during July and August.

This list of Irises are the best of the old standard varieties and are far better and healthier than lots of the new ones. Have added a few of the newer varieties that are extra good and beautiful. Prices are within reach of all.

## How to Grow Peonies

Plant Peony roots in average garden soil. Plant three feet apart each way.

Plant with the top eye or bud two inches below the surface.

Plant for the future.

Use only bone meal and wood ashes on the surface.

Keep all kinds of manure from the roots. Firm the surface soil and cover with

straw, six inches deep, the first winter.

Plant in full sunshine and in well-drained soil.

When cutting for blooms, leave some leaves on stalk.

Peonies are three to five eyes, standard divisions, healthy and true to name.

Divisions are from three-year-old plants. I grow my own Peonies. Delivery begins August 15 to December.

No spring shipment.

Ratings are by the American Peony Society.

Orders are shipped prepaid, anywhere in the United States. No order for less than \$1.00. Send check or draft.

It takes a peony root three years to overcome transplanting, so do not expect too much at first.
