## for 1932-1933

Every bulb that I sell is positively guaranteed to be full size, ciean, true to name and free from disease.

Any shipment not fully up to the expectation of the customer may be returned and purchase price plus return charges will be promptly refunded. There have been no gladiolus thrips in my field, therefore there will be none on my bulbs.

It has come to be a matter of common knowledge that bulbs grown in the North Pacific Coast region are of superior quality, and this season has been an exceptionally favorable one. There has been no extreme heat and months of continuous sunshine, with an abundance of water for our overhead irrigation system, so that growth has been constant and even, and this year's crop should, if such a thing is possible, be better than usual.

## PRICES

Prices quoted in this list are extremely reasonable. Some may be too low and other growers may quote below me on some varieties.

It has always been my practice to give very liberal overcount on orders, and also liberal extras in varieties not ordered, and this year I'm going even further than usual in this respect, so that my customers will be protected against the possibility of lower prices. If you have any preference in the matter of extras, I'll be glad to have you state it. You will get some anyway, and I'd prefer to send something that will please you. I can't guarantee to give you just what you name, but I'll do the best I can.

Transportation charges will be prepaid to all points in United States and Canada.
Safe delivery of all orders is guaranteed, and this includes damage by freezing, so you need not hesitate to order at any time. I do not ordinarily forward shipments by mail during extremely cold weather, but if you want your order for Christmas or any particular time, I will get it to you.

By the way, why would it not be a good idea to use bulbs more extensively for Christmas gifts? Can you think of anything that would give more real or lasting pleasure to a flower lover ? Think it over.

Early orders will be forwarded as soon as bulbs are ready for shipment.

## TERMS

Terms are cash with order except that, if desired, a deposit of $25 \%$ will hold order until March 1st, when it will be sent C. O. D. for any amount unpaid at that time.

## DISCOUNTS

Will allow cash discount of $5 \%$ on orders of $\$ 25.00$ to $\$ 50.00 ; 10 \%$ on orders of $\$ 50.00$ or more. Will also give liberal overcount and extras on all orders, so that my customers will receive the discount in extra bulbs, which is offered in many lists, and the cash discount in addition.

If you contemplate placing a large order, please submit iist for special quotation.

## SUBSTITUTION

If out of any size ordered will send next size smaller, giving additional bulbs to more than cover difference in price. If you are not willing for me to do this, please so state in your order.

No substitution in varieties without permission. If you are willing to have me substitute in case I am out of any variety on your order, please say so. You may be sure that I will send something of greater value.

Please note carefully whether variety is priced "each" or "per 100". Ten bulbs for 8 times the price of one. Five at the 10 rate. Ten bulbs or 25 bulblets at the 100 price; 100 bulblets at the 1000 price. For less number add $10 \%$.
