These are particularly suitable for mixed borders, for naturalizing in shrubbery, by woodland walks, in the woods by streams and lakes, or in semi-wild outlying positions. They are perfectly hardy and will flourish and increase for years. Bulbs may be planted either in partial shade or in the full sun and they seem to thrive equally well in any ordinary soil.

## AZALEA INDICA

These highly decorative plants are now successfully raised in this country. They have a wide range of color and the flowers will keep from four to six weeks after being forced, provided they are not kept where the heat is too excessive. If on arrival the roots appear dry, soak them well in a pail of water. After being potted, place them in cool greenhouse. As the desired time for forcing is at hand, they should be transferred to a warmer house and in the process of forcing, the temperature should be increased to from 60-70 deg. until the flowers appear. As flowers develop, temperature should be reduced to give them more substance. Plants that are to flower in early Spring do not require this intense treatment. As some varieties are better adapted for early forcing, we are listing them in the order of flowering.
